

#### **FEAST OF THE CONVERSION OF ST. PAUL:**

Thursday, January 25<sup>th</sup>, is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. Paul was a strong Hebrew before becoming a follower of Christ. We might describe Paul as an example of a "religious" Jew. His family was God-fearing. Like his father, Paul was a Pharisee and was educated by a very respected rabbi named Gamaliel. The exact date of his birth is not known but can be presumed to be within a decade of Jesus' birth. Paul was one of the most influential leaders of the early Christians. He played a crucial role in spreading the gospel to the Gentiles (non-Jews) during the first century, and his three missionary journeys took him all throughout the Roman empire. Paul started more than twelve churches. And he is considered the writer of the 13 epistles in the New Testament.

However, before Paul was known as a tireless evangelizer of Christianity, he was well-known for persecuting those who had become Christians. In the book of the Acts of the Apostles, we are told that Paul was even present at the death of the first Christian martyr, where he "approved the stoning of Stephen, the first deacon" (Acts 8:1) However, by the end of his life, Paul had endured many severe

persecutions as a Christian himself!

Furious that some of the Jews had decided to follow the Way of Jesus, Paul went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogue in Damascus. He was determined to persecute everyone; men or women following Jesus and bring them to Jerusalem as prisoners. As Paul came near Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute Me". Saul asked, "who are you, Lord?" "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." Those traveling with Saul stood speechless; they heard the sound but did not see anyone. Saul got up from the ground but when he opened his eyes, he could see nothing. So, they led him by the hand into Damascus. For three days he was blind and did not eat or drink anything" (Acts 9:1-9).

In Damascus there was a disciple named Ananias. The Lord called to him in a vision and asked him to go to the house of Judas on Straight Street and ask for a man from Tarsus named Saul. Ananias was troubled. He heard about all the harm that Saul had done to the Christians in Jerusalem and was now in pursuit of doing the same! But the Lord said to Ananias, "Go! This man is my chosen instrument to proclaim my name to the Gentiles and their kings and to the people of Israel. I will show him now much he must suffer for my name." Ananias then went to the house where Saul was, and laid his hands on Saul saying, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here, has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit." Immediately something like scales fell from Saul's eyes and he could see again. He got up and was baptized and after taking some food, he regained his strength" (Acts 9:10-11).

Paul spent the next few days with the very Christians he had come to capture, and he immediately began preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ to the confusion of Christians and Jews alike. It took time for Paul's reputation as a Christian preacher to outgrow his reputation as a persecutor of Christians. Several times in his thirteen epistles Paul mentions his conversion. This encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus completely changed his purpose of his journey from trying to silence the Christians to trying to speak out in support of them. Instead of taking away from the numbers of Christians, he was adding to them. He spent himself tirelessly preaching the gospel of the Lord and suffered bitterly including being put in more than once. He was beheaded by the emperor Nero around 68 AD.

Before closing may I add an explanation for Paul being called Saul and then Paul. Saul is a Hebrew name and Paul was the Greek word for Saul. As Paul began to evangelize in Greek communities (most of the New Testament was written in Greek), it made sense that we see the Greek version of his name after his conversion. That is why after his conversion, Paul is used. There is so much more to share about this great Apostle of Jesus. Perhaps some may be interested in a few bible sessions on the letters of St. Paul.

#### FIESTA DE LA CONVERSIÓN DE SAN PABLO PABLO:

El jueves 25 de enero es la fiesta de la Conversión de San Pablo. Pablo era un fuerte hebreo antes de convertirse en seguidor de Cristo. Podríamos describir a Pablo como un ejemplo de judío "religioso". Su familia era temerosa de Dios. Al igual que su padre, Pablo era fariseo y fue educado por un rabino muy respetado llamado Gamaliel. No se conoce la fecha exacta de su nacimiento, pero se puede suponer que fue una década después del nacimiento de Jesús. Pablo fue uno de los líderes más influyentes de los primeros cristianos. Desempeñó un papel crucial en la difusión del Evangelio a los gentiles (no judíos) durante el siglo I, y sus tres viajes misioneros le llevaron por todo el imperio romano Pablo fundó más de doce iglesias. Y se le considera el escritor de las 13 epístolas del Nuevo Testamento.

Sin embargo, antes de ser conocido como evangelizador incansable del cristianismo, Pablo era conocido por perseguir a los que se habían hecho cristianos. En el libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, se nos dice que Pablo incluso estuvo presente en la muerte del primer mártir cristiano, donde "aprobó la lapidación de Esteban, el primer diácono (Hechos 8:1) Sin embargo, al final de su vida, iPablo había

soportado muchas persecuciones severas como cristiano él mismo!

Furioso porque algunos judíos habían decidido seguir el camino de Jesús, Pablo se dirigió al sumo sacerdote y le pidió cartas para la sinagoga de Damasco. Estaba decidido a perseguir a todos; hombres o mujeres que siguieran a Jesús y llevarlos a Jerusalén como prisioneros. Cuando Pablo se acercaba a Damasco, de repente una luz del cielo brilló a su alrededor. Cayó al suelo y oyó una voz que le decía: "Saulo, Saulo, ¿por qué me persigues?". Saulo preguntó: "¿Quién eres, Señor?". "Yo soy Jesús, a quien tú persigues. Ahora levántate y entra en la ciudad, y se te dirá lo que debes hacer". Los que viajaban con Saulo se quedaron mudos; oyeron el ruido, pero no vieron a nadie. Saulo se levantó del suelo, pero al abrir los ojos no veía nada. Entonces lo llevaron de la mano a Damasco. Durante tres días estuvo ciego y no comió ni bebió nada". (Hechos 9:1-9).

En Damasco había un discípulo llamado Ánanías. El Señor le llamó en una visión y le pidió que fuera a casa de Judas, en la calle Recta, y preguntara por un hombre de Tarso llamado Saulo. Ananías estaba preocupado. Se había enterado de todo el daño que Saulo había hecho a los cristianos de Jerusalén y ahora pretendía hacer lo mismo. Pero el Señor dijo a Ananías: "Ve; éste es mi instrumento escogido para anunciar mi nombre a los gentiles, a sus reyes y al pueblo de Israel. Ahora le mostraré lo mucho que debe sufrir por mi nombre". Ananías fue entonces a la casa donde estaba Saulo y le impuso las manos diciendo: "Hermano Saulo, el Señor Jesús, que se te apareció en el camino cuando venías hacia aquí, me ha enviado para que vuelvas a ver y seas lleno del Espíritu Santo." Inmediatamente algo como escamas cayeron de los ojos de Saulo y pudo ver de nuevo. Se levantó, se bautizó y, después de comer, recobró

las fuerzas" (Hch 9,10-11).

Pablo pasó los días siguientes con los mismos cristianos que había venido a capturar, e inmediatamente empezó a predicar el evangelio de Jesucristo ante la confusión de cristianos y judíos por igual. La reputación de Pablo como predicador cristiano tardó en superar la de perseguidor de cristianos. Varias veces en sus trece epístolas Pablo menciona su conversión. Este encuentro con Jesús en el camino de Damasco cambió por completo el propósito de su viaje, que pasó de intentar silenciar a los cristianos a intentar hablar en su favor. En lugar de reducir el número de cristianos, los aumentaba. Se dedicó incansablemente a predicar el evangelio del Señor y sufrió amargamente, incluso fue encarcelado más de una vez. Fue decapitado por el emperador Nerón alrededor del año 68 d.C.

Antes de terminar, permítanme añadir una explicación sobre el hecho de que Pablo se llamara Saulo y luego Pablo. Saulo es un nombre hebreo y Pablo era la palabra griega para Saulo. Como Pablo empezó a evangelizar en comunidades griegas (la mayor parte del Nuevo Testamento se escribió en griego) tenía sentido que viéramos la versión griega de su nombre después de su conversión. Por eso, después de su conversión, se utiliza Pablo. Hay mucho más que compartir sobre este gran Apóstol de Jesús. Tal vez algunos puedan estar interesados en algunas sesiones bíblicas sobre las cartas de San Pablo.

# Reclaim the Name

January is the month traditionally devoted to honoring the holy name of Jesus. What can we do to reclaim reverence for His name in a culture that considers it to be just another word?

Bow your head. "At the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth" (Philippians 2:10). Make a slight, reverent nod whenever you hear Jesus' name in public, in conversation, on TV or in movies.

Offer a prayer. Don't hesitate to ask others not to misuse God's or Jesus' names. If they don't

respond, offer a prayer of reparation: "I kneel before Thee and offer Thee reparation; I would make amends for all the blasphemies uttered against Thy holy name."

> Don't normalize blasphemy. Curate the media you watch, listen to, or sing along with. Avoid songs, shows, or movies in which Jesus's name is disrespected. We are called to strive for holiness, not worldliness. More importantly, it's a way to give Christ the reverence and love He is due.

# from ripture

#### Mark 1:21-28, What God says happens

In this Gospel passage, Jesus and His apostles entered the synagogue at Capernaum where Jesus taught those gathered on the Sabbath. It was customary for learned teachers to say, "Thus says the Lord..." Instead Jesus said, "I say

to you ... " He taught as one who spoke with the authority of God.

His calm authority astounded Jesus' listeners. Just as they began to wonder what it meant. He gave them a sign. He further demonstrated His authority by performing an exorcism. Spirits that bedeviled an unfortunate man at the synagogue recognized who Jesus was. They were forced to obey Him when He commanded them to depart,

despite their reluctance. In fact, God's power and authority isn't just a formality. What God says, happens.

> Our kind and gentle Savior is also our powerful and awesome Lord. As the Second Person of the Trinity, Jesus has supreme majesty and

we will one day appear before Him to be judged. Yes, He is our divine savior and mediator. But if we say, "Jesus is Lord," then we give Him our loyalty and obedience.



January 1 - Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. When we celebrate this feast, we honor Mary, but also acknowledge Jesus as true God and true Man.

January 8 - Baptism of the Lord (1st Century). Jesus began His public ministry by getting baptized by St. John the Baptist. Jesus was to be baptized to "fulfill all righteousness" (Matthew 3:15). This was also when God reveals lesus as His 'beloved Son' (Matthew 3:17).

January 26 - St. Paula (404). After

her husband - a Roman senator named Toxotius - died, St. Paula gave up her wealthy lifestyle for the Gospel, devoting herself to prayer, poverty, and charitable works. She also befriended and supported St. Jerome in translating the Vulgate.

January 31 - St. John Bosco (1888). Moved by the plight of the young. abandoned boys in Rome, St. John opened the Oratory of St. Francis de Sales and provided workshops for them in shoemaking and tailoring. In 1859, he founded the Salesians who were committed to education and mission work.



# What to do when prayer feels flat.

"I just don't feel close to God." "Is He really listening?" In fact, God is constantly pursuing us in love, wanting to share His joy with us (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1). Yet, even the most passionate prayer life can feel flat sometimes. Try these tips to keep prayer fresh:

> Cultivate gratitude. Although God never abandons us, factors like health or mood can affect our prayer. St. Alphonsus

Liguori recommended, 'Often recall the loving way in which [God] has acted toward you." Reviewing our blessings helps us appreciate God's love for us over time.

Don't wait to ask for help. God's heart is always opened to us. "Good" prayer happens when we're honest with Him. This is an exercise of faith, which He generously rewards.


