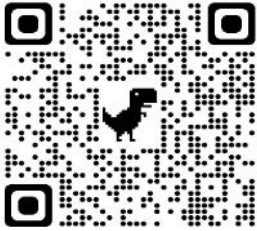

## LENTEN REGULATIONS 2024

**ABSTINENCE** – All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain totally from meat on **Ash Wednesday** (February 14) and **all Fridays** of Lent.

**FASTING** – All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on **Ash Wednesday** (February 14) and **Good Friday** (March 29). This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may also be taken on two other occasions during the day.

**EASTER DUTY** – After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time of the year. By special indult, in the United States, the time period for fulfilling this precept has been extended to include the period beginning the **First Sunday of Lent** (February 18) to **Pentecost Sunday** (May 19).

### **SALVATION HISTORY**

For the next several weeks, we will be focusing on Sacred Scripture. There is so much that we want to reflect on and understand better. It is difficult to do so in a short space and time. There are 73 books in the Catholic Bible: 46 books in the Old Testament and 27 books in the New Testament. My approach will be to focus our attention on God's fatherly plan in making covenants with His family throughout salvation history. The New Testament lies hidden in the Old Testament and the Old Testament is unveiled and made known in the New Testament.

Personally, I have found many of the books written by Scott Hahn, Ph.D. very informative and contributing greatly to my own on-going love and understanding of Sacred Scripture. In his book, "A Father Who Keeps His Promises", Scott Hahn delves into God's love and its implications in our lives seen through the lens of God's covenants. Very cleverly he aims to show us the big picture of salvation history.

Scott begins his book by telling a very moving story about the earthquake that happened in Armenia, Colombia in 1989. He tells about an extremely distressed father who, in the midst of the chaos, bolted through the winding streets that led up to the school where his son had gone to school earlier that morning. Arriving there, he only found a pile of rubble! At first, he just stood there, fighting back tears, and then took off, stumbling over debris, toward the east corner where he knew had been his son's classroom.

With his bare hands, he started to dig and dig. He was desperately pulling up bricks and pieces of wall-plaster while others stood by watching in incredible disbelief. He heard a person yelling, "Forget it, mister. They're all dead." The dad looked up and said, "You can grumble, or you can help me lift these bricks." Only a few began to help until their muscles began to ache. But the dear father couldn't stop thinking about his son. For hours, he kept digging and digging, ---twelve hours ... eighteen hours ... twenty-four hours ... thirty-six hours .... Finally, into the thirty-eighth hour, he heard a muffled groan from under a piece of wallboard. He grabbed the board, pulled it back, and cried, "ARMAND!" From the darkness he heard a slight shaking voice, "Papa...!?"

Other weak voices began calling out as they tried to move from under the still uncleared rubble. Gasps and shouts of bewildered relief came from the few onlookers and parents who had remained. They found fourteen of the thirty-three students still alive! When Armand finally emerged, he tried to help dig until all his surviving classmates were out. Everybody standing there heard him as he turned to his friends and said, "See, I told you my father wouldn't forget us." That is the kind of faith we need, because that's the kind of Father we have!

Sacred Scripture shows us how God, our Father, has cared for His family throughout the ages, making it possible for His children to live with Him forever in heaven. The Bible shows that our Heavenly Father has kept each and every one of the promises He swore concerning our redemption. This was fulfilled with the death and resurrection of His Only Son Jesus.

Each week we will focus on what God has done throughout history to make us His family and to save us from the misery of our sin and selfishness. God passionately seeks us! Our Father's firm intention is to bring us back into a loving relationship with Him. We recall that on the Jesse Tree during Advent, we hung an image of an apple and serpent symbolizing Adam and Eve's disobedience.

Our eternal Father never fails to fulfill His word. No matter what obstacles arise, He never loses sight of His goal: to form a human family to share in His love. As we reflect on Sacred Scripture, we should come to realize deeply just how great is God's personal love for each and every one of us, as members of His covenant family. In the following weeks we will reflect on the covenants that God has made.

### **CELEBRATION OF THE FIRST SCRUTINY**

During the 10:45 Mass today we will have the celebration of the First Scrutiny for two young men who will be baptized, confirmed, and receive Holy Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak or sinful, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good. The readings from Cycle A are used today at the 10:45 Mass only.

### **HISTORIA DE LA SALVACIÓN**

Durante las próximas semanas, nos centraremos en la Sagrada Escritura. Hay tantas cosas sobre las que queremos reflexionar y comprender mejor. Es difícil hacerlo en poco espacio y tiempo. Hay 73 libros en la Biblia católica: 46 libros en el Antiguo Testamento y 27 libros en el Nuevo Testamento. Mi enfoque consistirá en centrar nuestra atención en el plan paternal de Dios al establecer alianzas con su familia a lo largo de la historia de la salvación. El Nuevo Testamento se esconde en el Antiguo Testamento y el Antiguo Testamento se desvela y se da a conocer en el Nuevo Testamento.

Personalmente, he encontrado muchos de los libros escritos por Scott Hahn, Ph.D. muy informativos y que contribuyen en gran medida a mi propio amor y comprensión de las Sagradas Escrituras. En su libro, "Un Padre que Cumple sus Promesas", Scott Hahn profundiza en el amor de Dios y sus implicaciones en nuestras vidas vistas a través de la lente de los pactos de Dios. De forma muy inteligente, nos muestra el panorama general de la historia de la salvación.

Scott comienza su libro contando una historia muy conmovedora sobre el terremoto que se produjo en Armenia (Colombia) en 1989. Cuenta la historia de un padre muy angustiado que, en medio del caos, salió corriendo por las sinuosas calles que conducían a la escuela a la que su hijo había ido esa misma mañana. Al llegar allí, sólo encontró un montón de escombros! Al principio, se quedó parado, conteniendo las lágrimas, y luego se dirigió, tropezando con los escombros, hacia la esquina este, donde sabía que había estado la clase de su hijo.

Con las manos desnudas, empezó a cavar y cavar. Arrancaba desesperadamente ladrillos y trozos de yeso de las paredes mientras los demás observaban con increíble incredulidad. Oyó a una persona gritar: "Olvídelo, señor. Están todos muertos". El padre levantó la vista y dijo: "Podéis refunfuñar o ayudarme a levantar estos ladrillos". Sólo unos pocos empezaron a ayudar hasta que sus músculos empezaron a doler. Pero el querido padre no podía dejar de pensar en su hijo. Durante horas, siguió cavando y cavando, ---doce horas... dieciocho horas... veinticuatro horas... treinta y seis horas .... Por fin, a las treinta y ocho horas, oyó un gemido ahogado bajo un trozo de pared. Agarró la tabla, tiró de ella hacia atrás y gritó: "¡Armand!". Desde la oscuridad oyó una voz ligeramente temblorosa: "¿Papá...?".

Otras voces débiles empezaron a gritar mientras intentaban salir de debajo de los escombros aún sin limpiar. Los pocos espectadores y padres que quedaban lanzaron gritos de alivio. Catorce de los treinta y tres alumnos seguían con vida. Cuando Armand salió por fin, intentó ayudar a cavar hasta que todos sus compañeros supervivientes estuvieron fuera. Todos los que estaban allí le oyeron cuando se volvió hacia sus amigos y les dijo: "Lo veis, os dije que mi padre no se olvidaría de nosotros". Ésa es la clase de fe que necesitamos, ¡porque ésa es la clase de Padre que tenemos!

La Sagrada Escritura nos muestra cómo Dios, nuestro Padre, ha cuidado de su familia a lo largo de los siglos, haciendo posible que sus hijos vivan con Él para siempre en el cielo. La Biblia muestra que nuestro Padre Celestial ha cumplido todas y cada una de las promesas que juró con respecto a nuestra redención. Esto se cumplió con la muerte y resurrección de Su Único Hijo Jesús.

Cada semana nos centraremos en lo que Dios ha hecho a lo largo de la historia para convertirnos en su familia y salvarnos de la miseria de nuestro pecado y egoísmo. ¡Dios nos busca apasionadamente! La firme intención de nuestro Padre es devolvernos a una relación de amor con Él. Recordamos que en el Árbol de Jesé, durante el Adviento, colgamos una imagen de una manzana y una serpiente que simbolizaban la desobediencia de Adán y Eva.

Nuestro Padre eterno nunca deja de cumplir Su palabra. No importan los obstáculos que surjan, Él nunca pierde de vista Su objetivo: formar una familia humana que comparta Su amor. Al reflexionar sobre la Sagrada Escritura, deberíamos llegar a darnos cuenta profundamente de cuán grande es el amor personal de Dios por todos y cada uno de nosotros, como miembros de su familia de la Alianza. En las próximas semanas reflexionaremos sobre las alianzas que Dios ha hecho.

Durante la Misa de las 10:45 de hoy tendremos la celebración del Primer Escrutinio para dos jóvenes que serán bautizados, confirmados y recibirán la Sagrada Eucaristía en la Vigilia Pascual. **SUNDAY, MARCH 3, 2024 GOSPEL JN 2:13-25****A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN**

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me*. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

## **LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO SEGUN SAN JUAN**

Cuando se acercaba la Pascua de los judíos, Jesús llegó a Jerusalén y encontró en el templo a los vendedores de bueyes, ovejas y palomas, y a los cambistas con sus mesas. Entonces hizo un látigo de cordeles y los echó del templo, con todo y sus ovejas y bueyes; a los cambistas les volcó las mesas y les tiró al suelo las monedas; y a los que vendían palomas les dijo: "Quiten todo de aquí y no conviertan en un mercado la casa de mi Padre". En ese momento, sus discípulos se acordaron de lo que estaba escrito: *El celo de tu casa me devora*. Después intervinieron los judíos para preguntarle: "¿Qué señal nos das de que tienes autoridad para actuar así?" Jesús les respondió: "Destruyan este templo y en tres días lo reconstruiré". Replicaron los judíos: "Cuarenta y seis años se ha llevado la construcción del templo, ¿y tú lo vas a levantar en tres días?" Pero él hablaba del templo de su cuerpo. Por eso, cuando resucitó Jesús de entre los muertos, se acordaron sus discípulos de que había dicho aquello y creyeron en la Escritura y en las palabras que Jesús había dicho. Mientras estuvo en Jerusalén para las fiestas de Pascua, muchos creyeron en él, al ver los prodigios que hacía. Pero Jesús no se fiaba de ellos, porque los conocía a todos y no necesitaba que nadie le descubriera lo que es el hombre, porque él sabía lo que hay en el hombre.
