

50 DAYS OF EASTER

We continue our liturgical celebration of EASTER!!! This past week the octave of Easter came to a close. There are only two octaves in the entire liturgical calendar: 8 days after Christmas and 8 days after Easter Sunday. Last Sunday was the great feast of the Divine Mercy which gives us such a rich opportunity to reflect and deepen our gratitude to our Loving God for being so incredibly rich in mercy toward each one of us.

Throughout the liturgical season of Easter, the Scriptures give us such beautiful passages of how Jesus, in His Risen Body, appeared to His apostles and disciples. We must keep in mind that not even the apostles were really sure that it was really the Jesus who had died on the cross, is the Jesus who came back to life on Easter. So, we are told of some of the ways that Jesus made His

presence known as the Risen Lord.

In the Gospel of John 20:11-18 we find Mary Magdalene crying outside of the tomb thinking that someone had stolen Jesus' body. Then Jesus, (though she did not recognize Him) said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Thinking that he was the gardener, Mary Magdalene asked him to tell her where they had taken Jesus. At that point, Jesus said to her, "Mary!" Jesus told her that He had not yet ascended into heaven, but He asked her to go tell everyone that, "I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Mary quickly went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord," and then reported what he had told her.

We have the story of two of Jesus' disciples who on the very day that Jesus rose from the dead were walking along on the road to Emmaus which was seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking about what had happened on Good Friday. Jesus Himself came hear them but they did not recognize Him. Jesus asked them what they were talking about. The disciples seemed puzzled and asked, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem do does not know of the things that have taken place there these days?" They began sharing with Jesus (not yet knowing it was the Risen Jesus) many of the details that had happened as Jesus listened attentively. Jesus then began responded, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into His glory?" Jesus continued by helping them recall what the prophets had said. The disciples were impressed with his sharing and invited him to stay with them. While at table he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them." With this happening, the disciples recognized that He was Jesus. Jesus quickly disappeared. The disciples ran back to Jerusalem to tell everyone the great news that Jesus was indeed alive!!!

There is another scripture story that means a lot to me personally. After the death of Jesus, some of the apostles went back to their ordinarily life as fishermen. They fished all night and got nothing. I know little about fishing, but I am told that the best time to catch fish is during the night. When it was already dawn, Jesus (but they did not realize it was He) stood on the shore. Jesus asked them to cast their net to the right of the boat and they would catch fish. They caught so many fish (153 fish) that they could hardly haul the net to the shore. Jesus then invited them to

breakfast and served fish. They now had come to realize that He was the Risen Lord.

Now before I went to the Holy Land and often had read this passage, I used to think, "it must have been a late breakfast fish for breakfast!!! But in the hotels of the Holy Land, a typical breakfast had a variety of fish for BREAKFAST! Every time I read this passage; I relive my experience. We never cease to learn more and more, especially about the details that sometimes we simply pass over. Another little example: I knew that sometimes Jesus referred to His Father as "Abba" which is our "Daddy". Well, this hit me strongly when one night I went down to the Gift Shop in the Hotel. I asked the young man how much an article was, and he yelled over and said, "Abba, how much is this?" Next week we will continue with more on our 50 days of Easter!

50 DÍAS DE PASCUA

iiiContinuamos nuestra celebración litúrgica de PASCUA!!! Esta semana pasada concluyó la octava de Pascua. Sólo hay dos octavas en todo el calendario litúrgico: 8 días después de Navidad y 8 días después del Domingo de Pascua. El domingo pasado fue la gran fiesta de la Divina Misericordia que nos da una oportunidad tan rica para reflexionar y profundizar nuestra gratitud a nuestro Dios Amoroso por ser tan increíblemente rico en misericordia hacia cada uno de nosotros.

A lo largo del tiempo litúrgico de Pascua, las Escrituras nos ofrecen hermosos pasajes de cómo Jesús, en su Cuerpo Resucitado, se apareció a sus apóstoles y discípulos. Debemos tener en cuenta que ni siquiera los apóstoles estaban realmente seguros de que fuera realmente el Jesús que había muerto en la cruz, es el Jesús que volvió a la vida en Pascua. Así pues, se nos narran algunas de las formas en que Jesús dio a conocer Su presencia como Señor Resucitado.

En el Evangelio de Juan 20:11-18 encontramos a María Magdalena llorando fuera de la tumba pensando que alguien había robado el cuerpo de Jesús. Entonces Jesús, (aunque ella no lo reconoció) le dijo: "Mujer, ¿por qué lloras? ¿A quién buscas?" Pensando que era el jardinero, María Magdalena le pidió que le dijera dónde habían llevado a Jesús. En ese momento, Jesús le dijo: "iMaría!". Jesús le dijo que todavía no había subido al cielo, pero le pidió que fuera a anunciar a todos que: "Voy a mi Padre y a vuestro Padre, a mi Dios y a vuestro Dios." María fue rápidamente y anunció a los discípulos: "He visto al Señor", y luego les contó lo que le había dicho.

Contamos la historia de dos discípulos de Jesús que, el mismo día en que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos, iban por el camino de Emaús, a unos once kilómetros de Jerusalén. Hablaban de lo que había sucedido el Viernes Santo. Jesús mismo se acercó a oírlos, pero ellos no lo reconocieron. Jesús les pregunto de qué hablaban. Los discípulos parecían desconcertados y le preguntaron: "¿Eres tú el único visitante de Jerusalén que no sabe las cosas que han sucedido allí estos dias?" Comenzaron a compartir con Jesús (sin saber aún que era Jesús Resucitado) muchos de los detalles que habían sucedido mientras Jesús escuchaba atentamente. Entonces Jesús comenzó a responder: "¡Oh, qué necios sois! Qué lentos de corazón para que el Cristo padezca estas cosas y entre en su gloria". Jesús continuó ayudándoles a recordar lo que habían dicho los profetas. Los discípulos quedaron impresionados por su manera de compartir y le invitaron a quedarse con ellos. Estando a la mesa, tomó pan, pronunció la bendición, lo partió y se lo dio". Al suceder esto, los discípulos reconocieron que era Jesús. Jesús desapareció rápidamente. Los discípulos corrieron de vuelta a Jerusalén para contar a todo el mundo la gran noticia de que iiiJesús estaba realmente vivo!!!

Hay otra historia de las Escrituras que significa mucho para mí personalmente. Después de la muerte de Jesús, algunos de los apóstoles volvieron a su vida ordinaria de pescadores. Pescaron toda la noche y no consiguieron nada. Sé poco de pesca, pero me han dicho que el mejor momento para pescar es durante la noche. Cuando ya amanecía, Jesús (pero ellos no se dieron cuenta de que era Él) se paró en la orilla. Jesús les pidió que echaran la red a la derecha de la barca y pescarían. Pescaron tantos peces (153 peces) que apenas podían arrastrar la red hasta la orilla. Jesús les invitó a desayunar y les sirvió pescado. Ahora se habían dado cuenta de que Él era el Señor Resucitado.

Ahora bien, antes de ir a Tierra Santa y haber leído a menudo este pasaje, solía pensar: "iiidebe haber sido un desayuno tardío pescado para desayunar!!! Pero en los hoteles de Tierra Santa, iun desayuno típico tenía una variedad de pescado para DESAYUNAR! Cada vez que leo este pasaje; revivo mi experiencia. Nunca dejamos de aprender más y más, especialmente sobre los detalles que a veces simplemente pasamos por alto. Otro pequeño ejemplo: Yo sabía que a veces Jesús se refería a Su Padre como "Abba" que es nuestro "Papi". Pues bien, esto me impactó fuertemente cuando una noche bajé a la tienda de regalos del Hotel. Le pregunté al joven cuánto costaba un artículo, y él se acercó gritando y dijo: "Abba, ¿cuánto cuesta esto?". iLa próxima semana continuaremos con más sobre nuestros 50 días de Pascua!

SUNDAY, APRIL 14, 2024 GOSPEL LK 24:35-48

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you any-thing here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them. He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

DOMINGO,14 DE ABRIL 2024, EVANGELIO LC 24,35-48

LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO SEGUN SAN LUCAS

Cuando los dos discípulos regresaron de Emaús y llegaron al sitio donde estaban reunidos los apóstoles, les contaron lo que les había pasado en el camino y cómo habían reconocido a Jesús al partir el pan. Mientras hablaban de esas cosas, se presentó Jesús en medio de ellos y les dijo: "La paz esté con ustedes". Ellos, desconcertados y llenos de temor, creían ver un fantasma. Pero él les dijo: "No teman; soy yo. ¿Por qué se espantan? ¿Por qué surgen dudas en su interior? Miren mis manos y mis pies. Soy yo en persona. Tóquenme y convénzanse: un fantasma no tiene ni carne ni huesos, como ven que tengo yo". Y les mostró las manos y los pies. Pero como ellos no acababan de creer de pura alegría y seguían atónitos, les dijo: "¿Tienen aquí algo de comer?" Le ofrecieron un trozo de pescado asado; él lo tomó y se puso a comer delante de ellos. Después les dijo: "Lo que ha sucedido es aquello de que les hablaba yo, cuando aún estaba con ustedes: que tenía que cumplirse todo lo que estaba escrito de mí en la ley de Moisés, en los profetas y en los salmos". Entonces les abrió el entendimiento para que comprendieran las Escrituras y les dijo: "Está escrito que el Mesías tenía que padecer y había de resucitar de entre los muertos al tercer día, y que en su nombre se había de predicar a todas las naciones, comenzando por Jerusalén, la necesidad de volverse a Dios para el perdón de los pecados. Ustedes son testigos de esto".

GOSPEL REFLECTION


- An ancient tradition, based not on Scripture but on a sense of their bond, is that the risen Jesus must have appeared first to his blessed mother. The old Irish poem addresses her: Queen of all queens, oh wonder of the loveliness of women Heart that has held in check for us the righteous wrath of God, Strong staff of light and fosterer of the Bright Child of heaven, Pray thou for us as we now pray that we may be forgiven.
- In simple ways like eating a piece of fish, the disciples saw with the eyes
 of faith. He is showing them in simple ways that it is the same Lord as
 they knew in earlier days. The Lord of Easter is called the Christ of faith.
 We are blessed because we believe though we cannot see. Lord, I believe,
 strengthen my belief.
- Take this journey in prayer. Walk with the disciples and feel their fear and anxiety and sense of being let down. Feel their hope also that maybe his promise to rise will be fulfilled. What might this bring up in you? The darkness and the light, shared on the journey, hour by hour, with the Lord of light. Walk and listen; let Jesus remind you of the Scripture that brings trust, peace and confidence.
- In our relationship with Jesus, we too are tempted to think of him as a ghost. But, as he tells the disciples, he has flesh and blood as we do. He knows of what we are made. He shares everything we experience and offers us a share in everything he experiences, including his resurrection.
- Jesus had told his disciples that, when they gathered in his name, he would be in their midst. His presence brings peace, casts out fear. Do I let him give me his peace? Do I recognise fear as the counter-sign that it is?
- His resurrection breaks down all barriers, removes all divisions within us, between us and others, between us and God. His true disciples are ambassadors of reconciliation in every age. Who do I need to be reconciled with? Am I a source of unity or division for others? Do others encounter the power of his resurrection through me?




