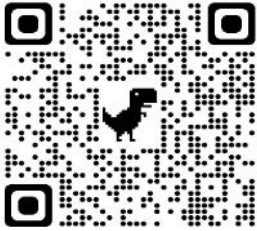

### **DIVINO NIÑO NOVENA**

On Wednesday, March 20th , at 7:00 pm in St. Nicholas of Tolentine Chapel, we will have the Divino Niño Novena. Due to the Stations of the Cross on Fridays during Lent, this Novena is changed from Friday to Wednesday.

Jesus, under His title of Divino Niño, many times has strongly encouraged us to turn to Him with our concerns and needs. During this novena, we have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

All are invited. A brief sharing of refreshments follows in the Faith Formation Center.

### **DIOCESAN EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL**

As was announced last week, on Saturday, April 20th , there will be a diocesan gathering of all our parishes with Bishop Brennan to celebrate in a very special way the EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL at the Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows. Arrival is between 8:00 am and 9:00 am and it ends at 3:00 pm.

You will recall that the National Eucharistic Revival is now in its final third year. Each diocese and parish have celebrated this on a local level. Nationally it will come to an end in Indianapolis in July. A huge celebration is being planned there. Participants are expected from all parts of the United States and beyond.

This Eucharistic Revival scheduled for Saturday, April 20th , is one way that our Diocese of Brooklyn is celebrating this Eucharistic Revival. Entrance is free. ### **LAETARE SUNDAY**

Some folks have been asking why the priest wore pink vestments last Sunday. It has been the custom that halfway between the beginning of Lent and Easter, we celebrate Laetare Sunday. Laetare is a Latin word for "rejoice".

It occurs on the fourth Sunday within Lent. It is a way that the Church encourages us to be faithful to the end of the period of Lent and look forward with joy to the grand celebration of the Risen Lord on Easter. We all have made some decisions to give up or do something special as our way of fulfilling the Lenten call to more prayer, sacrifice and almsgiving. We are getting there! Even the color pink is a joyful, happy color. That is why Father was wearing a pink vestment. Liturgically the color purple reminds us of penance etc.

On the third Sunday of Advent, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. Again, this is a Latin term for "rejoice". At this point in Advent, we are almost at the celebration of Christmas and are enthusiastically looking forward to its celebration. Also during Advent, the color purple reminds us that we are in a season of spiritual preparation.

For your chuckle or two, in the Novitiate, which are the years of formation preparing a woman to make the vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience as a Religious Sister, the liturgical season of Advent and Lent takes on a very serious dimension. One of the sacrifices asked of us was not to receive any mail from our families and friends during Advent and Lent. However, on Gaudete Sunday during Advent, and on Laetare Sunday during Lent we were given our mail. I have to acknowledge and recall so vividly, what joy erupted in the recreation room!!! To this day, so many, many years ago, I still somehow live that experience.

### **DOMINGO DE LAETARE**

Algunas personas se han preguntado por qué el sacerdote llevaba vestimentas rosado el domingo pasado. Es costumbre que a mitad de camino entre el comienzo de la Cuaresma y la Pascua, celebremos el Domingo de Laetare. Laetare significa "alegrarse" en latín.

Se celebra el cuarto domingo de Cuaresma. Es una forma en que la Iglesia nos anima a ser fieles al final del período de Cuaresma y a esperar con alegría la gran celebración del Señor Resucitado en Pascua. Todos hemos tomado la decisión de renunciar a algo o de hacer algo especial para cumplir la llamada cuaresmal a rezar más, a sacrificarnos más y a dar más limosna. Lo estamos consiguiendo. Incluso el color rosa es un color alegre y feliz. Por eso el Padre llevaba una vestidura rosa. Litúrgicamente, el color morado nos recuerda la penitencia, etc.

El tercer domingo de Adviento celebramos el Domingo de Gaudete. De nuevo, se trata de un término latino que significa "alégrete". En este momento del Adviento, estamos casi en la celebración de la Navidad y esperamos con entusiasmo su celebración. También durante el Adviento, el color morado nos recuerda que estamos en un tiempo de preparación espiritual.

En el noviciado, que son los años de formación que preparan a una mujer para hacer los votos de pobreza, castidad y obediencia como religiosa, el tiempo litúrgico de Adviento y Cuaresma adquiere una dimensión muy seria. Uno de los sacrificios que se nos pedía era no recibir ningún correo de nuestras familias y amigos durante el Adviento y la Cuaresma. Sin embargo, el domingo de Gaudete, durante el Adviento, y el domingo de Laetare, durante la Cuaresma, recibíamos nuestro correo. Tengo que reconocer y recordar tan vívidamente, ¡¡¡qué alegría estalló en la sala de recreo!!! Hasta el día de hoy, hace tantos y tantos años, sigo viviendo de alguna manera aquella experiencia.

**SUNDAY, MARCH 17, 2024 GOSPEL JN 12:20-33****A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN**

Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me. "I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." The crowd there heard it and said it was thunder; but others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered and said, "This voice did not come for my sake but for yours. Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." He said this indicating the kind of death he would die.

**DOMINGO, 17 DE MARZO 2024, EVANGELIO 12,20-33****LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO SEGUN SAN JUAN**

Entre los que habían llegado a Jerusalén para adorar a Dios en la fiesta de Pascua, había algunos griegos, los cuales se acercaron a Felipe, el de Betsaida de Galilea, y le pidieron: "Señor, quisiéramos ver a Jesús". Felipe fue a decírselo a Andrés; Andrés y Felipe se lo dijeron a Jesús y él les respondió: "Ha llegado la hora de que el Hijo del hombre sea glorificado. Yo les aseguro que si el grano de trigo, sembrado en la tierra, no muere, queda infecundo; pero si muere, producirá mucho fruto. El que se ama a sí mismo, se pierde; el que se aborrece a sí mismo en este mundo, se asegura para la vida eterna. El que quiera servirme, que me siga, para que donde yo esté, también esté mi servidor. El que me sirve será honrado por mi Padre. Ahora que tengo miedo, ¿le voy a decir a mi Padre: 'Padre, líbrame de esta hora'? No, pues precisamente para esta hora he venido. Padre, dale gloria a tu nombre". Se oyó entonces una voz que decía: "Lo he glorificado y volveré a glorificarlo". De entre los que estaban ahí presentes y oyeron aquella voz, unos decían que había sido un trueno; otros, que le había hablado un ángel. Pero Jesús les dijo: "Esa voz no ha venido por mí, sino por ustedes. Está llegando el juicio de este mundo; ya va a ser arrojado el príncipe de este mundo. Cuando yo sea levantado de la tierra, atraeré a todos hacia mí". Dijo esto, indicando de qué manera habría de morir.

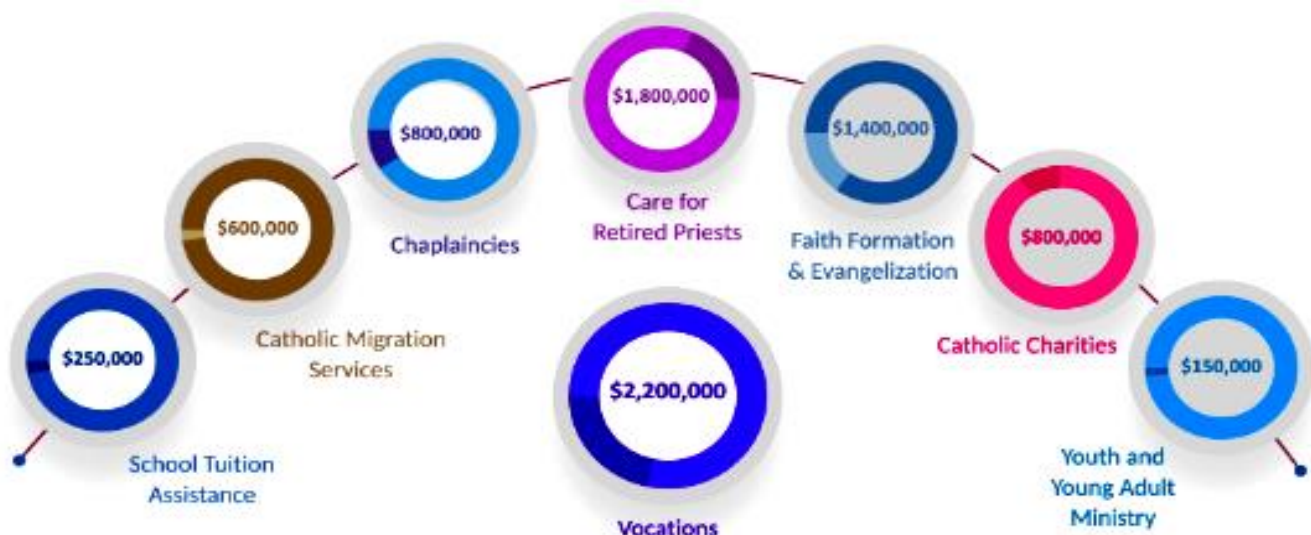
