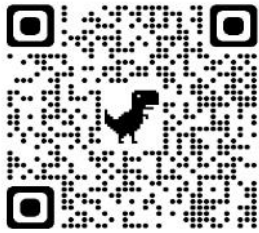

Next Sunday we will have our monthly Hospitality Sunday after the 9:15 Mass, the 10:45 Mass, and the 12:15 Mass. It gives us an opportunity to gather together over coffee etc. and get to know one another more and more as a great parish family.

DIOCESAN CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

As we have noted, the United States three-year Eucharistic Revival will be closing in July in Indianapolis. That will be a huge gathering. From what I have read, it seems that there will be processions coming to Indianapolis from the Southeast, Northeast, Southwest, and Northwest, all converging in Indianapolis for this celebration.

The Diocese of Brooklyn and Queens is having its culminating celebration of the Eucharistic Revival on Saturday, April 20th at the Tennis Court in Flushing Meadows. Arrival is between 8:00am and 9:00am with the official opening at 9:00am and its closing at 3:00pm.

Entrance is free. However, each parish has been allocated 50 tickets. But I as the parish coordinator for this event, must submit ASAP the names, telephone numbers, and email addresses of those who plan to attend. Therefore, though April 20th seems far away with so much on our minds, it is imperative that you inform Sister Alice of your intention to participate ASAP.

BLESSED HOLY WATER

During the Easter Vigil many bottles of water were blessed and are available today after all the Masses. Having holy water in the home has been a long tradition. A donation would be greatly appreciated.

EASTER SEASON

We have entered the 50 days of the liturgical season of Easter which will end on Pentecost Sunday. The celebration of the Easter Vigil with its many parts is so powerful. Strikingly when we entered the church, we found it all in darkness! The new fire was lit outside of the church. The new Paschal Candle was lit and carried into the church by our deacon. Three times we sang, "Light of Christ" as progressively everyone's candle is lit. The Paschal Candle is symbolic of the Risen Jesus. Before Jesus died and rose from the dead on Easter, due to Adam and Eve's sin, relationship with God had been severed. Through His Paschal Mystery, Jesus' death and resurrection, He broke through the darkness of the power of sin and death and brought us His new life: a close relationship with Him and the promise of eternal life.

Three adults received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist during the Vigil and one young adult who was Christian, but not Catholic, made his profession of faith in the Catholic Church, received Confirmation and the Eucharist. We congratulate them and welcome them into our parish life. All of us, with our candle lit, renewed our baptismal promises. Throughout our daily lives, we are called to strengthen our relationship with Christ and live according to our baptismal commitment.

CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

On Friday, April 26th, at 5:00 pm the students from St. Nicholas of Tolentine Academy and those in our Faith Formation Program will be receiving the sacrament of Confirmation. Bishop Tiedemann will be the celebrant.

CELEBRATION OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

On Saturday, May 11th, at 10:00 am the students from St. Nicholas of Tolentine Academy and those in our Faith Formation Program will be receiving Jesus for the first time in the Eucharist. Let us pray for those preparing for Confirmation and those preparing for First Holy Communion as well as for all their families, that these celebrations may be deep spiritual experiences for them.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

The second Sunday of Easter is the great Feast of Divine Mercy. In next week's bulletin, we will explain this feast and Jesus' apparition to St. Faustina.

CELEBRACIÓN DIOCESANA DEL AVIVAMIENTO EUCARÍSTICO

Como hemos señalado, en julio se clausurará en Indianápolis el Avivamiento Eucarístico trienal de Estados Unidos. Será una reunión multitudinaria. Por lo que he leído, parece que habrá procesiones que vendrán a Indianápolis desde el Sureste, Noreste, Suroeste y Noroeste, todas convergiendo en Indianápolis para esta celebración.

La Diócesis de Brooklyn y Queens tendrá su celebración culminante del Avivamiento Eucarístico el sábado 20 de abril en la Pista de Tenis de Flushing Meadows. La llegada es entre las 8:00am y las 9:00am con la apertura oficial a las 9:00am y su clausura a las 3:00pm.

La entrada es gratuita. Sin embargo, a cada parroquia se le han asignado 50 entradas. Pero yo, como coordinadora parroquial de este evento, debo enviar lo antes posible los nombres, números de teléfono y direcciones de correo electrónico de quienes piensan asistir. Por lo tanto, aunque el 20 de abril parece lejano con tantas cosas en nuestras mentes, es imperativo que informen a la Hermana Alice de su intención de participar lo antes posible.

AGUA BENDITA

Durante la Vigilia Pascual se bendijeron muchas botellas de agua que hoy están disponibles después de todas las misas. Tener agua bendita en casa ha sido una larga tradición. Un donativo sería muy apreciado.

TIEMPO PASCUAL

Hemos entrado en los 50 días del tiempo litúrgico de Pascua que terminará el domingo de Pentecostés. La celebración de la Vigilia Pascual con sus múltiples partes es tan poderosa. Sorprendentemente, cuando entramos en la iglesia, ¡la encontramos toda a oscuras! El nuevo fuego se encendió fuera de la iglesia. El nuevo Cirio Pascual fue encendido y llevado a la iglesia por nuestro diácono. Tres veces cantamos "Luz de Cristo" mientras progresivamente se encendía el cirio de cada uno. El cirio pascual simboliza a Jesús resucitado. Antes de que Jesús muriera y resucitara de entre los muertos en Pascua, debido al pecado de Adán y Eva, la relación con Dios se había cortado. A través de su Misterio Pascual, la muerte y resurrección de Jesús, Él rompió la oscuridad del poder del pecado y la muerte y nos trajo su nueva vida: una estrecha relación con Él y la promesa de la vida eterna.

Tres adultos recibieron los sacramentos del Bautismo, la Confirmación y la Eucaristía durante la Vigilia y un joven adulto que era cristiano, pero no católico, hizo su profesión de fe en la Iglesia católica, recibió la Confirmación y la Eucaristía. Los felicitamos y les damos la bienvenida a nuestra vida parroquial. Todos nosotros, con nuestra vela encendida, renovamos nuestras promesas bautismales. A lo largo de nuestra vida cotidiana, estamos llamados a reforzar nuestra relación con Cristo y a vivir de acuerdo con nuestro compromiso bautismal.

SUNDAY, MARCH 31, 2024 GOSPEL JN 20:1-9**A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN**

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

DOMINGO, 31 DE MARZO 2024, EVANGELIO 20,1-9

LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO SEGUN SAN JUAN

El primer día después del sábado, estando todavía oscuro, fue María Magdalena al sepulcro y vio removida la piedra que lo cerraba. Echó a correr, llegó a la casa donde estaban Simón Pedro y el otro discípulo, a quien Jesús amaba, y les dijo: "Se han llevado del sepulcro al Señor y no sabemos dónde lo habrán puesto". Salieron Pedro y el otro discípulo camino del sepulcro. Los dos iban corriendo juntos, pero el otro discípulo corrió más aprisa que Pedro y llegó primero al sepulcro, e inclinándose, miró los lienzos puestos en el suelo, pero no entró. En eso llegó también Simón Pedro, que lo venía siguiendo, y entró en el sepulcro. Contempló los lienzos puestos en el suelo y el sudario, que había estado sobre la cabeza de Jesús, puesto no con los lienzos en el suelo, sino doblado en sitio aparte. Entonces entró también el otro discípulo, el que había llegado primero al sepulcro, y vio y creyó, porque hasta entonces no habían entendido las Escrituras, según las cuales Jesús debía resucitar de entre los muertos.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

- On this strange dawn we are praying in a darkness that is outside time, like that of astronauts circling in space: beyond sunsets and sunrises, seeing the beginning and the end of our days. We look back to that breathless morning when the apostles saw the holy women come back from the tomb with a story of angels. A bloodless corpse, transfixed by a spear, had risen again with a mysterious new life. Jesus had kept his promise. Death, our oldest enemy, had been mastered.
- Wherever we share compassion, justice, reconciliation, faith, and encourage each other to be people of hope, we are people of the resurrection and ministers of the resurrection. Jesus is raised from death each time we live his way of life. We do this in our various ways of showing care and concern for the lives and troubles of others. Easter prayer can be an asking in prayer to be ministers of the resurrection, as we discern how best to serve the risen Lord.
- The tomb was empty and, for the faithful ones, this was a sign of new life. Some would remember Jesus saying he would rise from death. Others would feel down, cheated or just lost. It is the same with ourselves: the tough times of life can bring us close to God, or distance us; suffering can make us better people, or make us bitter and isolated. We may feel a bit of both at times. The empty tomb is the message that nothing is final in this life, not even death. God's love is stronger than any human power, violence or cruelty. Love conquers all.
- It is the 'first day of the week'. Mary Magdalene is the first witness of an event which marks not just the beginning of a new week but the transformation of human history. But 'it is still dark' and she does not yet understand what has happened. I ponder the mystery.
- Peter and the other disciple, who had stood faithfully beneath the cross, run to the tomb. The other disciple saw and believed. Peter, whose last recorded action was to deny Jesus, still does not believe. What blocks me from fuller faith?
- When Jesus raised Lazarus, Lazarus had to be freed from his grave-clothes. Jesus' grave-clothes are rolled up and lying on the side, a reflection of his mastery over death. I stand in the doorway beside the entrance and stare into that empty tomb. Do I grasp the difference between this resurrection and that of Lazarus?

EASTER TRIDUUM

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion
- Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord
