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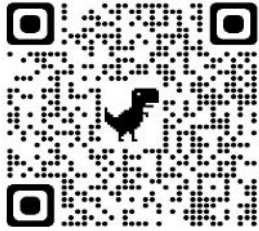

EASTER 50 DAYS CONTINUED

The Old Testament prefigures the New Testament, and the New Testament fulfills the Old Testament. There are many examples of this in Sacred Scripture. In this week's bulletin we will focus on Jesus' title as "The Lamb of God".

Let us recall that as St. John the Baptist was preaching a message of repentance and preparation for the coming of the Savior, he looked up and saw Jesus. He immediately referred to Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. With this title, John the Baptist was directly recalling the history of the Jewish people. Centuries before John the Baptist and Jesus, the Jewish people were being severely treated as slaves in Egypt. Eventually God freed His people from slavery with the sacrifice of a lamb during Passover. John was announcing that Jesus would be the Sacrificial Lamb of a new Passover: a Passover from sin and death.

God chose Moses to be the instrument to bring the Jewish people out of this slavery into freedom. God allowed nine plagues to try to bring Pharaoh to finally let the people go, but at the end he always repented and held them back. Finally, as we find in Exodus 12:1-14, God asked the Jewish people to prepare an unblemished lamb and sprinkle some of the blood of the lamb on the doorposts of the Jewish people so that the angel of death would pass over these houses. God asked that they consume the lamb that very night, eat unleavened bread and bitter herbs. If possible, please read all of Exodus 12 to fill in more of the details. God also asked that every year this Passover Meal be celebrated remember what God had done for them by freeing them from slavery in Egypt.

The blood of the lamb in the Old Testament freed the Jewish people from slavery. By Jesus shedding His blood on the cross, He freed us from the power of sin and death. The first Passover lamb was sacrificed to save the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt. The Jewish people ate the Passover lamb in order to receive freedom and new life. Jesus is the Lamb of God. He is the sacrifice of a new Passover. His sacrifice was done once and for all. He died for everyone. Jesus sacrificed His own life to save everyone from sin and death. We receive new life in Christ when we eat the Eucharist.

Thus, the first Passover lamb was sacrificed to save the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt. This was a prefiguration of the ultimate salvation through Jesus Christ that God had in store for all people. Jesus, the Lamb of God, sacrificed His own life to save us all from the power of sin and death. This connection was proclaimed by John the Baptism at the very beginning of Jesus' three years of making God known, teaching the way to live our daily lives so that we may one day we may fully experience living our new life with God for every.

There is still another aspect to reflect on. Throughout the Old Testament the priest offered many animal sacrifices every day in atonement of his sins and those of all people. Only once a year, on the Day of Atonement, did the high priest enter the holy of holies and sacrifice a lamb again in atonement for his sins and those of the whole world. The priest would place his hands on the head of the lamb, symbolizing his and everyone's sins, and send this animal out to die. Of course, we know that no animal can atone for the sins of the whole world. Only JESUS, THE LAMB OF GOD, did so once and for all. Jesus' sacrificing His life on the cross for us is not repeated. It was done on Good Friday almost 2000 years ago. Jesus did not offer sacrifice on the cross for Himself; He had no sin. He willingly did out of complete love for each of us. What is more??? At every Mass, every day, Jesus makes present in an unbloody way what He did for us on the cross. And Jesus continues to intercede for us; He prays for us!!!

PASCUA 50 DÍAS CONTINUACIÓN

El Antiguo Testamento prefigura el Nuevo Testamento, y el Nuevo Testamento cumple el Antiguo Testamento. Hay muchos ejemplos de esto en la Sagrada Escritura. En el boletín de esta semana nos centraremos en el título de Jesús como "Cordero de Dios".

Recordemos que mientras San Juan Bautista predicaba un mensaje de arrepentimiento y preparación para la venida del Salvador, levantó la vista y vio a Jesús. Inmediatamente se refirió a Jesús como el Cordero de Dios que quita los pecados del mundo. Con este título, Juan el Bautista estaba recordando directamente la historia del pueblo judío. Siglos antes de Juan el Bautista y Jesús, el pueblo judío era severamente tratado como esclavo en Egipto. Finalmente, Dios liberó a su pueblo de la esclavitud con el sacrificio de un cordero durante la Pascua. Juan estaba anunciando que Jesús sería el Cordero Sacrificado de una nueva Pascua: una Pascua del pecado y de la muerte.

Dios eligió a Moisés para que fuera el instrumento que sacara al pueblo judío de esta esclavitud y lo llevara a la libertad. Dios permitió que nueve plagas intentaran que el faraón dejara marchar, finalmente al pueblo, pero al final siempre se arrepentía y los retenía. Finalmente, como encontramos en Exodo 12:1-14, Dios le pidió al pueblo judío que preparara un cordero sin mancha y rociara un poco de la sangre del cordero en los postes de las puertas del pueblo judío para que el ángel de la muerte pasara sobre estas casas. Dios pidió que consumieran el cordero esa misma noche, comieran pan sin levadura y hierbas amargas. Si es posible, lea todo Exodo 12 para conocer más detalles. Dios también pidió que cada año se celebrara esta comida pascual recordando lo que Dios había hecho por ellos al liberarlos de la esclavitud en Egipto.

La sangre del cordero en el Antiguo Testamento liberó al pueblo judío de la esclavitud. Al derramar Jesús su sangre en la cruz, nos liberó del poder del pecado y de la muerte. El primer cordero pascual fue sacrificado para salvar al pueblo judío de la esclavitud en Egipto. El pueblo judío comió el cordero pascual para recibir la libertad y una nueva vida. Jesús es el Cordero de Dios. Él es el sacrificio de una nueva Pascua. Su sacrificio se hizo de una vez por todas. Murió por todos. Jesús sacrificó su propia vida para salvar a todos del pecado y de la muerte. Recibimos una nueva vida en Cristo cuando comemos la Eucaristía.

Así, el primer cordero pascual fue sacrificado para salvar al pueblo judío de la esclavitud en Egipto. Era una prefiguración de la salvación definitiva que Dios tenía reservada para todos los hombres por medio de Jesucristo. Jesús, el Cordero de Dios, sacrificó su propia vida para salvarnos a todos del poder del pecado y de la muerte. Esta conexión fue proclamada por Juan el Bautista al comienzo de los tres años de Jesús dando a conocer a Dios, enseñando la manera de vivir nuestra vida cotidiana para que un día podamos experimentar plenamente nuestra nueva vida con Dios para todos.

Todavía hay otro aspecto sobre el que reflexionar. A lo largo del Antiguo Testamento, el sacerdote ofrecía todos los días muchos sacrificios de animales en expiación de sus pecados y los de todo el pueblo. Sólo una vez al año, en el Día de la Expiación, el sumo sacerdote entraba en el lugar santísimo y volvía a sacrificar un cordero en expiación de sus pecados y los de todo el mundo. El sacerdote ponía sus manos sobre la cabeza del cordero, que simbolizaba sus pecados y los de todo el mundo, y enviaba a este animal a morir. Por supuesto, sabemos que ningún animal puede expiar los pecados de todo el mundo. Sólo JESUS, EL CORDERO DE DIOS, lo hizo de una vez por todas. El sacrificio de Jesús en la cruz por nosotros no se repite. Fue hecho el Viernes Santo hace casi 2000 años. Jesús no ofreció el sacrificio en la cruz por sí mismo; El no tenía pecado. El voluntariamente lo hizo por completo amor por cada uno de nosotros. ¿Qué más se puede pedir? En cada Misa, cada día, Jesús hace presente de manera incruenta lo que hizo por nosotros en la cruz. Y Jesús sigue intercediendo por nosotros; ¡¡¡Ora por nosotros!!!

SUNDAY, APRIL 21, 2024 GOSPEL JN 10:11-18**A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN**

This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again. This command I have received from my Father."

LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO SEGUN SAN JUAN

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a los fariseos: "Yo soy el buen pastor. El buen pastor da la vida por sus ovejas. En cambio, el asalariado, el que no es el pastor ni el dueño de las ovejas, cuando ve venir al lobo, abandona las ovejas y huye; el lobo se arroja sobre ellas y las dispersa, porque a un asalariado no le importan las ovejas. Yo soy el buen pastor, porque conozco a mis ovejas y ellas me conocen a mí, así como el Padre me conoce a mí y yo conozco al Padre. Yo doy la vida por mis ovejas. Tengo además otras ovejas que no son de este redil y es necesario que las traiga también a ellas; escucharán mi voz y habrá un solo rebaño y un solo pastor. El Padre me ama porque doy mi vida para volverla a tomar. Nadie me la quita; yo la doy porque quiero. Tengo poder para darla y lo tengo también para volverla a tomar. Este es el mandato que he recibido de mi Padre".

GOSPEL REFLECTION

- We know leaders who want influence or money, who value their own reputation and life above that of their followers, and who can be bought. Such leaders are a sad mistake, and we live to regret giving them power. Lord, you are a fearless leader. Death has no terrors for you. You value the life of your followers above your own. You are not in it for the money, but you know me and love me.
- The love of Jesus is love onto death. It is the self-sacrificing love which we see on the cross. It is the love which never sits down under feelings of failure but can always see the resurrection ahead in some form or other. In caring for all people, Jesus knew something of the resurrection, for in love are the seeds of resurrection. We rise above the self-centredness that confines and narrows us, to the outgoing love which expands our hearts and minds, as our hearts and minds grow to be like the heart and mind of Jesus.

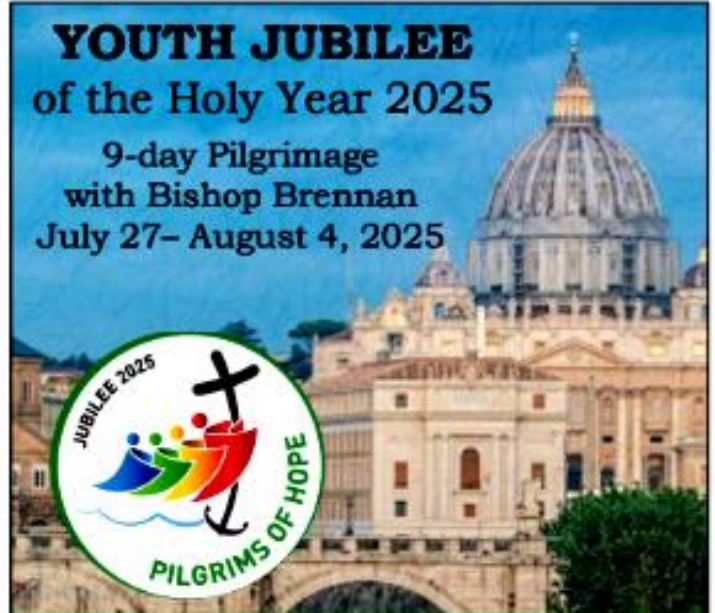
