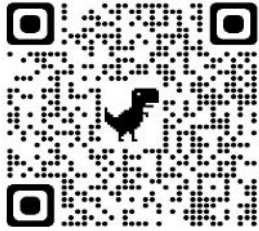

**FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION**

August 6th is the Feast of the Transfiguration of Jesus. On the second Sunday of Lent every year: Cycle A, Cycle B, and Cycle C the Gospel tells us of the event of the transfiguration of Jesus. This fact should make us realize that this was an important event in the life of Jesus.

Mt. Tabor is a very high mountain in the Holy Land. The buses can take us only to a certain point; then all the passengers are distributed to several taxis. I counted 17 turns as the taxis drove up that mountain! Upon reaching the top, it is an incredible scene of Jerusalem!

We could say that the body of Jesus was like a cloak covering the glory of His spirit. No one on earth can see God as He is in heaven. For a moment, Jesus showed to the three apostles, Peter, John and James just a glimpse of God's glory, that is, as God really is!!! It was something so great that even the clothes of Jesus became dazzling white and brilliant as lightning. (Luke 9:29).

Prior to this event, the apostles had already confessed Jesus as the Messiah: Peter had made confession for them all. (Luke 9:18-21). Yet, Jesus knew that their faith in Him would be shaken when they would witness Jesus' passion and death. What they saw on the mountain helped them to recover their faith after the shock of Jesus' suffering and death.

Obviously, the apostles understood that what they had witnessed on the mountain was nothing compared with the glory bestowed on Jesus by the Father at His resurrection. This experience added to their determination to be faithful to their Master who promised that one day they would share in His very same glory: "Father, I want those you have given Me to be with Me where I am, so that they may always see the glory you have given Me." (John 17:24).

Through Jesus' transfiguration on Mt. Tabor gave the apostles a glimpse of our glorified new life. Suffering and death do not have the last word. Yes, there will be suffering, disappointments, etc., but our glorified life awaits all who faithfully follow Jesus.

Peter never forgot what he had seen on the mountain and shared his conviction concerning what faith should be in the life of a Christian. In his letter, 2 Peter 1:19, he wrote "...a lamp for lighting our way through the dark until dawn comes, and the morning star (Jesus) rises in your minds." Our faith in Christ is a lantern we carry to see our way in a world darkened by sin. It helps us to see our way to heaven; to see the obstacles blocking our way; it helps us to see the things of this world as they really are: God's gifts to be used gratefully, nothing to attach our hearts to.

Peter, John, and James would have liked to remain forever on the mountain, so deep was the joy they experienced at seeing Jesus' glory. Faith brings us joy, a joy no one can take, a share in the very joy of Jesus. In Paul's letter to his Christians of Philippi, he says, "Our homeland is heaven" (Phil. 3:20). And what is more, we have the words of Jesus to His apostles after the Last Supper: "Your sorrow will be turned into joy" (John 16:20). "I have told you this that my own joy may be in you, and your joy be complete." (John 15:11).

This special Feast of the Transfiguration of Jesus should help us to recall the nature of our calling, as Peter tells us, and have been called to continue the work of Christ on earth. Like him, we carry within us the life of the Spirit, the very life of God. The day will come, when this divine life within us is to burst out in all its brightness, similar, not just to the brightness of Jesus on the mountain, but to His glory on the day of His resurrection. On that day, we shall exclaim like Peter: "Lord, it is wonderful for us to be here." (Matthew 17:4). Though, we shall pass through suffering and death, we shall come to share in Christ's light and joy FOREVER!

### **FIESTA DE LA TRANSFIGURACIÓN**

El 6 de agosto es la fiesta de la Transfiguración de Jesús. Cada año, el segundo domingo de Cuaresma: Ciclo A, Ciclo B y Ciclo C, el Evangelio nos narra el acontecimiento de la transfiguración de Jesús. Este hecho debe hacernos comprender que se trató de un acontecimiento importante en la vida de Jesús.

El monte Tabor es una montaña muy alta de Tierra Santa. Los autobuses sólo pueden llevarnos hasta cierto punto; después, todos los pasajeros se distribuyen en varios taxis. ¡Conté 17 giros mientras los taxis subían esa montaña! Al llegar a la cima, ¡es una escena increíble de Jerusalén!

Podríamos decir que el cuerpo de Jesús era como un manto que cubría la gloria de su espíritu. Nadie en la tierra puede ver a Dios como está en el cielo. Por un momento, Jesús mostró a los tres apóstoles, Pedro, Juan y Santiago sólo una vislumbre de la gloria de Dios, es decir, ¡¡¡como Dios realmente es!!! Fue algo tan grande que incluso las ropas de Jesús se volvieron de un blanco deslumbrante y brillantes como el relámpago. (Lucas 9:29).

Antes de este acontecimiento, los apóstoles ya habían confesado a Jesús como el Mesías: Pedro había hecho la confesión por todos ellos. (Lucas 9:18-21). Sin embargo, Jesús sabía que su fe en Él se tambalearía cuando presenciaran la pasión y muerte de Jesús. Lo que vieron en la montaña les ayudó a recuperar la fe después de la conmoción del sufrimiento y la muerte de Jesús.

Obviamente, los apóstoles comprendieron que lo que habían presenciado en la montaña no era nada comparado con la gloria otorgada a Jesús. nada comparado con la gloria que el Padre concedió a Jesús en su resurrección. Esta experiencia en Esta experiencia aumentó su determinación de ser fieles a su Maestro, que les había prometido que un día compartirían Su misma gloria: «Padre, quiero que los que me has dado estén conmigo donde yo estoy, para que vean siempre la gloria que me has dado». (Juan 17:24).

La transfiguración de Jesús en el monte Tabor permitió a los apóstoles vislumbrar nuestra nueva vida glorificada. El sufrimiento y la muerte no tienen la última palabra. Sí, habrá sufrimiento, decepciones, etc., pero nuestra vida glorificada espera a todos los que siguen fielmente a Jesús.

Pedro nunca olvidó lo que había visto en la montaña y compartió su convicción sobre lo que debe ser la fe en la vida de un cristiano. En su carta, 2 Pedro 1:19, escribió «...una lámpara para alumbrar nuestro camino en la oscuridad hasta que amanezca y el lucero de la mañana (Jesús) salga en vuestras mentes». Nuestra fe en Cristo es una linterna que llevamos para ver nuestro camino en un mundo oscurecido por el pecado. Nos ayuda a ver nuestro camino al cielo; a ver los obstáculos que bloquean nuestro camino; nos ayuda a ver las cosas de este mundo como realmente son: Regalos de Dios que hay que usar con gratitud, nada a lo que apegar nuestro corazón.

Pedro, Juan y Santiago hubieran querido quedarse para siempre en la montaña, tan profunda era la alegría que experimentaban al ver la gloria de Jesús. La fe nos trae alegría, una alegría que nadie puede quitarnos, una participación en la alegría misma de Jesús. En la carta de Pablo a sus cristianos de Filipos, dice: «Nuestra patria es el cielo» (Flp 3,20). Y lo que es más, tenemos las palabras de Jesús a sus apóstoles después de la Última Cena: «Vuestra tristeza se convertirá en alegría» (Jn 16,20). «Os he dicho esto para que mi propia alegría esté en vosotros, y vuestra alegría sea completa». (Juan 15:11).

Esta fiesta especial de la Transfiguración de Jesús debe ayudarnos a recordar la naturaleza de nuestra vocación, como nos dice Pedro, y hemos sido llamados a continuar la obra de Cristo en la tierra. Como él, llevamos en nosotros la vida del Espíritu, la vida misma de Dios. Llegará el día en que esta vida divina que llevamos dentro estalle en todo su resplandor, semejante no sólo al resplandor de Jesús en la montaña, sino a su gloria el día de su resurrección. Ese día, exclamaremos como Pedro: «Señor, es maravilloso que estemos aquí». (Mateo 17:4). Aunque pasemos por el sufrimiento y la muerte, illegaremos a compartir la luz y la alegría de Cristo PARA SIEMPRE!

**SUNDAY, AUGUST 4, 2024 GOSPEL JN 6:24-35****A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN**

When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus. And when they found him across the sea they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus answered them and said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal." So they said to him, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent." So they said to him, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: *He gave them bread from heaven to eat.*" So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

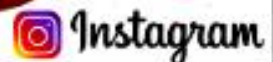
