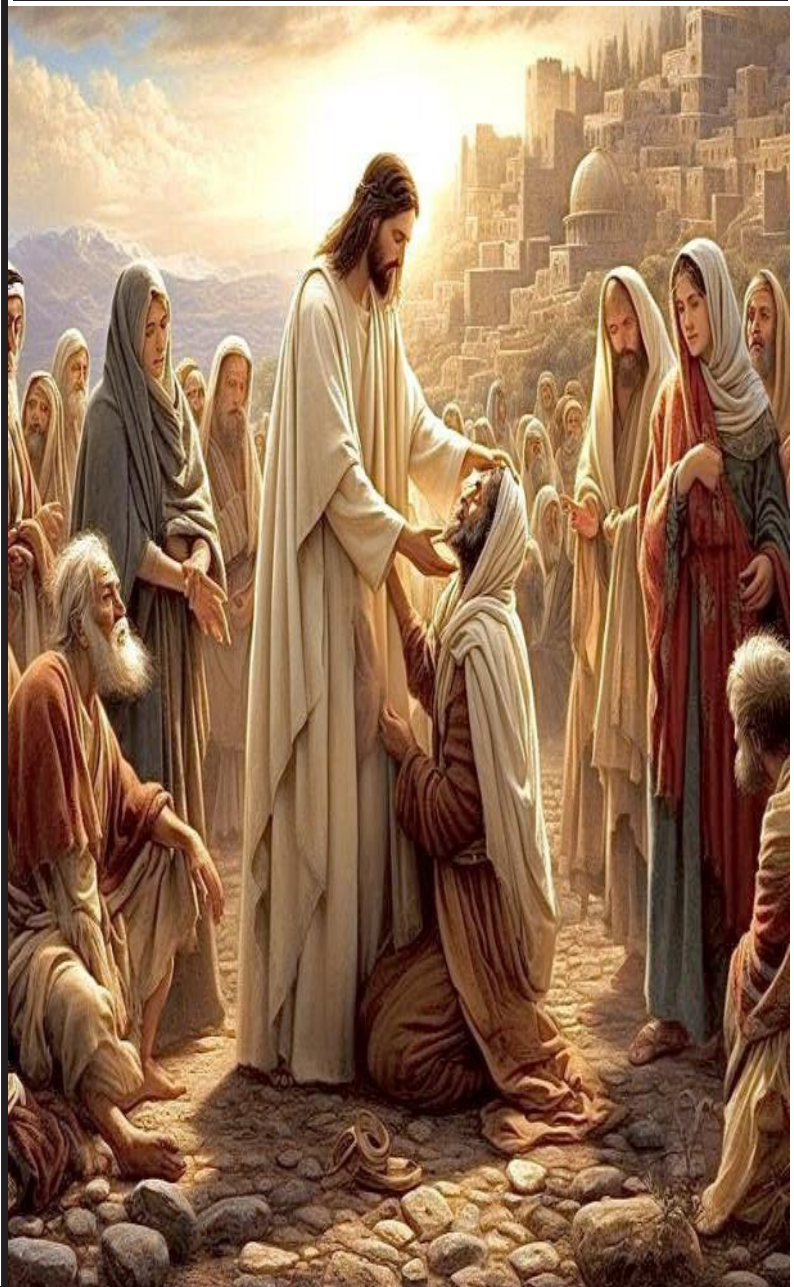

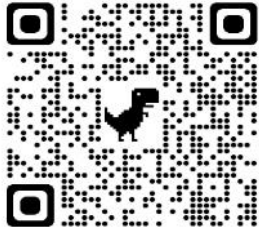

At midnight as Sunday rolls in on November 3rd, our time changes by turning back our clocks one hour. I am sure everyone will appreciate an extra hour's sleep!!!

HOSPITALITY SUNDAY

Next Sunday, November 3rd, is our monthly Hospitality Sunday after the 9:15 am Mass and the 10:45 am Mass in Tolentine Hall. All are invited!

NOVEMBER 1ST: ALL SAINTS DAY

Friday, November 1st, is All Saints Day which is one of the six days of obligation. For Catholics, it is like a Sunday; we come to Mass. Our Mass schedule for this feast: Thursday, October 31st, 7:30 pm; Friday, November 1st: 7:30 am, 12:05 pm, and 7:30 pm.

On All Saints Day we honor all the saints who are in heaven. They were human like each one of us who tried to place God at the center of their lives and tried to live each day according to the Way that Jesus came to reach us. In a special way on this day, we honor their achievement!

Sometimes we hear that Catholics worship the saints. No, not at all. We only worship God; we honor saints. We do not genuflect before any statue or image of a saint. We only genuflect before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament!

Many of us have our own personal saints that we ask them to intercede for us. However, the saints in heaven are not only the popular well-known saints that we all know. Many of our family members, friends, co-workers, and neighbors are already in heaven. They may not have gone directly to heaven, but after their being made ready in Purgatory, they are now in heaven.

On Sunday, November 3rd, our Faith Formation children will process into our Church at the end of the 9:15 am Mass and for the entrance to the 10:45am Mass dressed as different saints.

NOVEMBER 2nd: ALL SOULS DAY

Saturday, November 2nd is the day that we pray in a very special way for all our departed loved ones. As mentioned above, some of our loved ones may already be in heaven. However, others may still be in Purgatory being made ready for their entrance into heaven. The Masses that are offered for our loved ones help them in their purification. At every Mass during the Eucharistic Prayer, we pray for all who have gone before us.

The souls in Purgatory cannot do anything themselves to get into heaven; they depend on our prayers. However, what a blessing, they can pray for us. They need our prayers; yet we can benefit from their prayers. That is part of our great Catholic Faith.

The Mass schedule for All Souls Day: 7:45am, 12:05pm which will be the Mass especially offered for our faithful departed, and then the usual 5:00pm Mass for Sunday.

ST. MARTIN DE PORRES

November 3rd is the feast day of St. Martin de Porres. However, because this year it falls on a Sunday, the Sunday liturgy supersedes the feast.

He was a Peruvian lay brother of the Dominican Order. Under Peruvian law, descendants of Africans and Native Americans were barred from becoming full members of religious orders. He asked the Dominicans of Holy Rosary Priory in Lima, to accept him as a volunteer who performed menial tasks in the monastery in return for the privilege of wearing the habit and living with the religious community. When he was 24, he was allowed to profess religious vows as a Dominican lay brother.

St. Martin de Porres is the patron saint of mixed-race people, barbers, innkeepers, public health workers, all those seeking racial harmony, and animals. He was noted for his work on behalf of the poor. St. Martin de Porres established an orphanage and a children's hospital. He is known for having lived an austere life, which included fasting and abstaining from meat. Among the many miracles attributed to him were those levitation, bilocation, miraculous knowledge, instantaneous cures, and an ability to communicate with animals.

1 DE NOVIEMBRE: DÍA DE TODOS LOS SANTOS

El viernes 1 de noviembre es el Día de Todos los Santos, que es uno de los seis días de precepto. Para los católicos, es como un domingo; asistimos a misa. Nuestro horario de misas para esta festividad: jueves 31 de octubre, 7:30 pm; viernes 1 de noviembre: 7:30 am, 12:05 pm y 7:30 pm.

El Día de Todos los Santos honramos a todos los santos que están en el cielo. Ellos eran humanos como cada uno de nosotros que trataron de poner a Dios en el centro de sus vidas y trataron de vivir cada día de acuerdo con el Camino que Jesús vino a alcanzarnos. De una manera especial en este día, honramos su logro! A veces escuchamos que los católicos adoramos a los santos. No, en absoluto. Nosotros solo adoramos a Dios; honramos a los santos. No hacemos genuflexiones ante ninguna estatua o imagen de un santo. ¡Solo hacemos genuflexiones ante Jesús en el Santísimo Sacramento!

Muchos de nosotros tenemos nuestros propios santos personales a los que les pedimos que intercedan por nosotros. Sin embargo, los santos en el cielo no son solo los santos populares y conocidos que todos conocemos. Muchos de nuestros familiares, amigos, compañeros de trabajo y vecinos ya están en el cielo. Puede que no hayan ido directamente al cielo, pero después de ser preparados en el Purgatorio, ahora están en el cielo. El domingo 3 de noviembre, nuestros niños de Formación de Fe ingresarán a nuestra Iglesia al final de la Misa de las 9:15 am y para la entrada a la Misa de las 10:45 am vestidos como diferentes santos.

2 DE NOVIEMBRE: DÍA DE LOS DIFUNTOS

El sábado 2 de noviembre es el día en que oramos de una manera muy especial por todos nuestros seres queridos que han partido. Como se mencionó anteriormente, algunos de nuestros seres queridos pueden estar ya en el cielo. Sin embargo, otros pueden estar todavía en el Purgatorio preparándose para su entrada al cielo. Las Misas que se ofrecen por nuestros seres queridos los ayudan en su purificación. En cada Misa durante la Plegaria Eucarística, oramos por todos los que se han ido antes que nosotros.

Las almas del Purgatorio no pueden hacer nada por sí mismas para entrar al cielo; dependen de nuestras oraciones. Sin embargo, qué bendición, ellas pueden orar por nosotros. Necesitan nuestras oraciones; sin embargo, podemos beneficiarnos de sus oraciones. Eso es parte de nuestra gran Fe Católica.

El horario de las misas para el Día de los Fieles Difuntos: 7:45 am, 12:05 pm que será la misa especialmente ofrecida por nuestros fieles difuntos, y luego la misa habitual de las 5:00 pm del domingo.

SAN MARTÍN DE PORRES

El 3 de noviembre es el día festivo de San Martín de Porres. Sin embargo, como este año cae en domingo, la liturgia dominical reemplaza la fiesta.

Era un hermano laico peruano de la Orden Dominicana. Según la ley peruana, los descendientes de africanos y nativos americanos tenían prohibido convertirse en miembros de pleno derecho de las órdenes religiosas. Pidió a los dominicos del Priorato del Santo Rosario en Lima que lo aceptaran como voluntario que realizaba tareas domésticas en el monasterio a cambio del privilegio de vestir el hábito y vivir con la comunidad religiosa. Cuando tenía 24 años, se le permitió profesar los votos religiosos como hermano laico dominico.

San Martín de Porres es el santo patrón de las personas de raza mixta, los barberos, los posaderos, los trabajadores de la salud pública, todos aquellos que buscan la armonía racial y los animales. Se destacó por su trabajo en favor de los pobres. San Martín de Porres fundó un orfanato y un hospital infantil. Es conocido por haber vivido una vida austera, que incluía el ayuno y la abstinencia de carne. Entre los muchos milagros que se le atribuyen están la levitación, la bilocación, el conocimiento milagroso, la curación instantánea y la capacidad de comunicarse con los animales.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2024 GOSPEL MK 10:46:52**A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO ST. MARK**

As Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way.

DOMINGO, 27 DE OCTUBRE 2024, EVANGELIO MC 10,46-52

LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO SEGUN SAN MARCOS

En aquel tiempo, al salir Jesús de Jericó en compañía de sus discípulos y de mucha gente, un ciego, llamado Bartimeo, se hallaba sentado al borde del camino pidiendo limosna. Al oír que el que pasaba era Jesús Nazareno, comenzó a gritar: "¡Jesús, hijo de David, ten compasión de mí!" Muchos lo reprendían para que se callara, pero él seguía gritando todavía más fuerte: "¡Hijo de David, ten compasión de mí!". Jesús se detuvo entonces y dijo: "Llámenlo". Y llamaron al ciego, diciéndole: "¡Ánimo! Levántate, porque él te llama". El ciego tiró su manto; de un salto se puso en pie y se acercó a Jesús. Entonces le dijo Jesús: "¿Qué quieres que haga por ti?" El ciego le contestó: "Maestro, que pueda ver". Jesús le dijo: "Vete; tu fe te ha salvado". Al momento recobró la vista y comenzó a seguirlo por el camino.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

- Lord, I sometimes open my eyes in the morning, and do not notice the sunshine, the green of trees, the colours in my room, the warmth or sorrow in the faces around me. If I had been blind, like Bartimaeus in today's gospel, I would long to open my eyes and see all that is to be seen. I could not have enough of this light-filled world around me.
- Give me a relish, Lord, for all that my eyes can take in: not the pre-selected shots of the TV screen, but the endlessly varied landscape and peopescap that surrounds me. I pray with Bartimaeus: /Master, let me receive my sight/.
- Without his cloak the blind man could be even more lost - he would lose protection from the elements. It was one of his most essential possessions. In going to Jesus, he let it go. In prayer there is much letting-go. We hand over disappointments, hurts and grief as best we can. We hand them over to the one who loves us and gives much more in return.
- Bartimaeus was an irritation to the crowd; they asked him to keep quiet, they were embarrassed by the attention he was drawing. Might there be some part of me that I prefer to keep silent? I lead all my needs be given expression as I am here in prayer.
- The fickle crowd encouraged Bartimaeus once they heard Jesus call him forward. I pray for the courage I need to recognize what is important to Jesus and to bring it to life.
- I listen to Jesus speak to me as he spoke to Bartimaeus. He asks, 'What do you want me to do for you?'
