**HOSPITALITY SUNDAY**

After the 9:15 am Mass and the 10:45 am Mass, we will have our monthly "Hospitality Sunday". All are invited to Tolentine Hall.

**CHILDREN'S ALL SAINTS PROCESSION**

Though the feast of All Saints was on Friday, November 1st, our children from the Faith Formation Classes will celebrate it today by processing into our church dressed as some of our many saints. They will enter just before the 9:15 Mass is about to end, and then they will be part of the Entrance Procession to our 10:45 Mass.

It is important that the children come to know more about the saints. They, as well as all of us, have to come to realize that the saints were human persons like you and I, young and old, and not so old! They experienced much of life as we do. However, they tried to live in words and actions according to the Way that Jesus has taught us. Yes, the lifestyle of many saints can astound us, but each of us in our own lives can try to faithfully follow Jesus. Through our baptism, we are all called to become saints before we enter into the kingdom of heaven. Each week we will try to write a brief history of the lives of the saints that the Church is celebrating each week.

As you must realize from your own experience, each student who is going to receive the sacrament of Confirmation must choose a saint's name for Confirmation. If the student's baptismal name is that of a saint, they may choose to keep that name or choose another saint's name for Confirmation. In either case, as part of their preparation for Confirmation, they must write a paper on the life of the saint, why they have chosen that saint, and how they plan to try to imitate that saint in their own daily lives.

We can also pray to the saints, asking them to obtain from Jesus what we need to be faithful followers of Jesus, and one day be with them in heaven.

**ST. MARTIN OF TOURS**

November 11th is the feast of St. Martin of Tours who was born in Hungary in 316. He came from a pagan family. However, at the age of 10 he chose to become Christian. As a youth he was forced into the Roman army, but later he petitioned the Roman emperor to be released from the army because in his words, "I am Christ's soldier. I am not allowed to fight." Many accused him of being a coward. His response to this was to offer to stand in front of the battle line only with the "sign of the cross". He was put in prison but before long, he was discharged.

He did something incredible while he was still in the military and a catechumen. A catechumen is a person who is not baptized but is preparing through a process of formation to becoming Catholic. Every year, here at St. Nicholas of Tolentine, and at other churches, we have catechumens preparing to receive their sacraments of initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist.

While Martin was still in the military and a catechumen, Martin saw a poor man trembling from the cold with no cloak of any kind to keep him warm. Martin used his sword to cut his own cloak in half to share it with the beggar. That night Martin dreamed Jesus Himself was clothed with the torn cloak. When he woke up, the cloak was restored into one piece again. Moved by this vision and apparent miracle, Martin immediately finished his religious instruction and was baptized at age 18. Martin went on to being ordained a priest. In 371 Martin became the bishop of Tours. He is known to have founded a number of monasteries. He was a very active, committed missionary.

What can you and I learn from Martin? How can we imitate him even in small ways?

**PROCESIÓN DE LOS NIÑOS DE TODOS LOS SANTOS**

Aunque la fiesta de Todos los Santos fue el viernes 1 de noviembre, nuestros niños de las Clases de Formación de la Fe la celebrarán hoy procesionando hacia nuestra iglesia vestidos como algunos de nuestros muchos santos. Entrarán justo antes de que termine la Misa de las 9:15 am, y luego serán parte de la Procesión de Entrada a nuestra Misa de las 10:45 am.

Es importante que los niños conozcan más sobre los santos. Ellos, así como todos nosotros, tenemos que llegar a comprender que los santos eran personas humanas como tú y yo, jóvenes y viejos, ¡y no tan viejos! Experimentaron gran parte de la vida como nosotros. Sin embargo, trataron de vivir en palabras y acciones de acuerdo con el Camino que Jesús nos ha enseñado. Sí, el estilo de vida de muchos santos puede asombrarnos, pero cada uno de nosotros en nuestra propia vida puede tratar de seguir fielmente a Jesús. A través de nuestro bautismo, todos estamos llamados a convertirnos en santos antes de entrar en el reino de los cielos. Cada semana trataremos de escribir una breve historia de las vidas de los santos que la Iglesia celebra cada semana.

Como debe darse cuenta por su propia experiencia, cada estudiante que va a recibir el sacramento de la Confirmación debe elegir el nombre de un santo para la Confirmación. Si el nombre de bautismo del estudiante es el de un santo, puede elegir mantener ese nombre o elegir el nombre de otro santo para la Confirmación. En cualquier caso, como parte de su preparación para la Confirmación, debe escribir un ensayo sobre la vida del santo, por qué ha elegido ese santo y cómo planea tratar de imitar a ese santo en su propia vida diaria.

También podemos orar a los santos, pidiéndoles que obtengan de Jesús lo que necesitamos para ser fieles seguidores de Jesús y un día estar con ellos en el cielo.

**SAN MARTÍN DE TOURS**

El 11 de noviembre es la festividad de San Martín de Tours, que nació en Hungría en el año 316. Provenía de una familia pagana. Sin embargo, a los 10 años decidió convertirse al cristianismo. De joven fue obligado a alistarse en el ejército romano, pero más tarde pidió al emperador romano que lo liberara del ejército porque, en sus palabras, "soy un soldado de Cristo. No me está permitido luchar". Muchos lo acusaron de ser un cobarde. Su respuesta fue ofrecerse a permanecer al frente de la línea de batalla solo con la "señal de la cruz". Fue encarcelado, pero al poco tiempo fue dado de baja.

Hizo algo increíble mientras todavía estaba en el ejército y era catecúmeno. Un catecúmeno es una persona que no está bautizada pero que se prepara a través de un proceso de formación para convertirse en católica. Todos los años, aquí en San Nicolás de Tolentino y en otras iglesias, tenemos catecúmenos que se preparan para recibir sus sacramentos de iniciación, Bautismo, Confirmación y Sagrada Eucaristía. Mientras Martín todavía estaba en el ejército y era catecúmeno, vio a un hombre pobre que temblaba de frío y no tenía ningún tipo de manto para abrigarse. Martín usó su espada para cortar su manto por la mitad y compartirlo con el mendigo. Esa noche, Martín soñó que Jesús mismo estaba vestido con el manto roto. Cuando despertó, el manto estaba restaurado en una sola pieza. Conmovido por esta visión y aparente milagro, Martín terminó inmediatamente su instrucción religiosa y fue bautizado a los 18 años. Martín fue ordenado sacerdote. En 371, Martín se convirtió en obispo de Tours. Se sabe que fundó varios monasterios. Fue un misionero muy activo y comprometido.

¿Qué podemos aprender tú y yo de Martín? ¿Cómo podemos imitarlo, aunque sea en pequeñas cosas?

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions.

**LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO SEGUN SAN MARCOS**

En aquel tiempo, uno de los escribas se acercó a Jesús y le preguntó: "¿Cuál es el primero de todos los mandamientos?" Jesús le respondió: "El primero es: Escucha, Israel: El Señor, nuestro Dios, es el único Señor; amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con toda tu mente y con todas tus fuerzas. El segundo es éste: Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. No hay ningún mandamiento mayor que éstos". El escriba replicó: "Muy bien, Maestro. Tienes razón, cuando dices que el Señor es único y que no hay otro fuera de él, y amarlo con todo el corazón, con toda el alma, con todas las fuerzas, y amar al prójimo como a uno mismo, vale más que todos los holocaustos y sacrificios". Jesús, viendo que había hablado muy sensatamente, le dijo: "No estás lejos del Reino de Dios". Y ya nadie se atrevió a hacerle más preguntas.
