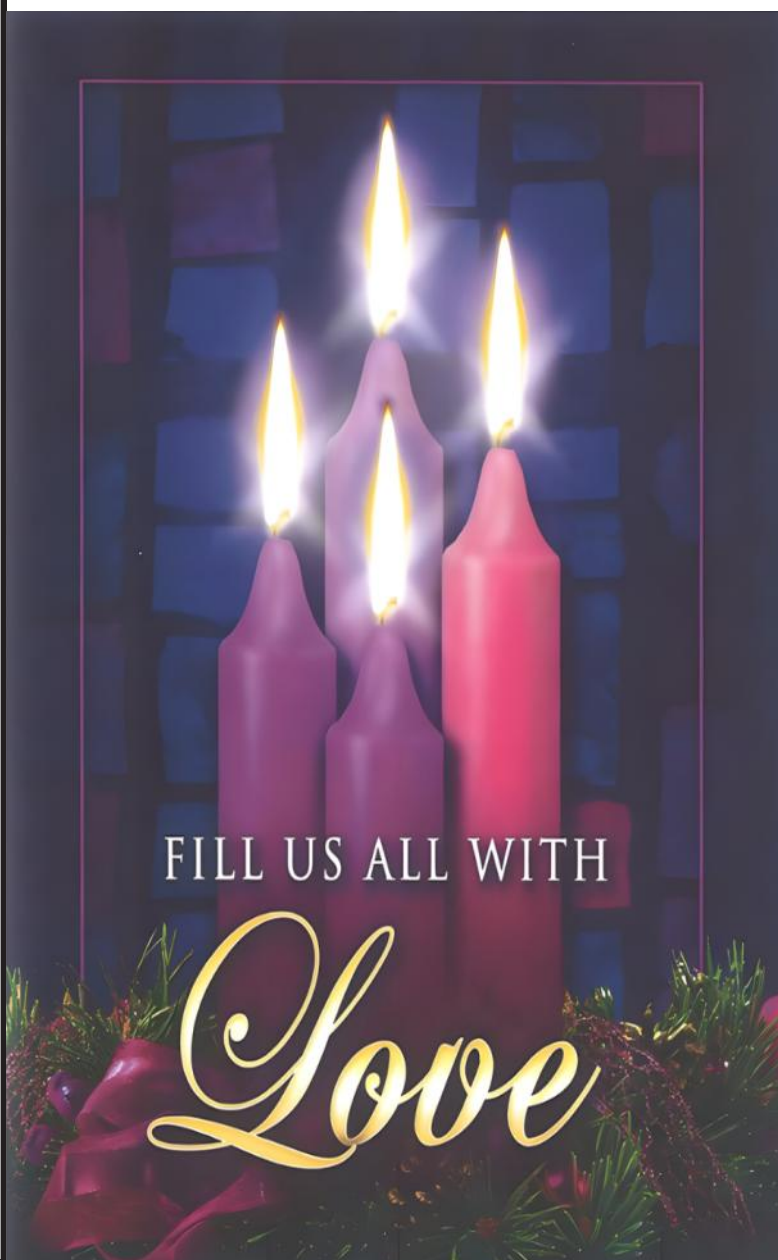

ADVENT/CHRISTMAS PREPARATIONS

At St. Nicholas of Tolentine, it is customary that on the Saturday before the Second Sunday of Advent, one of the aspects of the Filipino custom called “Simbang Gabi” is celebrated as a preparation for Christmas. It is comprised of parts of our salvation history with narration, song, and dramatization with different members of our parish family from a variety of cultures participating. We thank Bing Custodio who is known to be coordinating this endeavor for years with much enthusiasm and zeal. The photo below gives us a glimpse of the celebration!

Last Friday, December 12th, our parish community celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. One aspect of this feast is Diocesan. Parishes who wish to participate in a long walking procession from the Co-Cathedral of St. Joseph on Pacific Street in Brooklyn back to their own parish, formally register to be a part of this and this year all were wearing blue sweatshirts. As I watched it on NET it was a sea of blue! This year the Brooklyn parishes gathered at the 9:00 am Mass with Bishop Brennan as the main celebrant; the Queens parishes gathered at the 1:00 pm Mass at the Co-Cathedral with Bishop Brennan again as the main celebrant. Here there were 40 runners from our Parish.

When the 1:00 pm Mass ended (almost 3:00 pm) Bishop Brennan lit one very tall torch for each parish. This lit torch which was carried throughout the run, symbolizes Jesus as our Light. The respective parishes began running, walking, trotting, etc. singing and praying all the way to St. Nicholas of Tolentine Church. It took them almost 4 hours to reach here very tired and hungry! They just about made it for the 7:00 pm Mass celebrated here with Bishop Cabezas as the main celebrant. By the way, our Father Noel was one of the runners!!!

After Mass there was typical food and entertainment with piñatas for the children. It was a joy-filled celebration. Many people worked very hard in a variety of ways to make this a memorable feast. We are very grateful to everyone who contributed in any way toward this feast.

Mary’s words to Juan Diego, “Did you not know that I am here, I am your Mother”. Mary had asked Juan Diego to come to her to receive something of a proof for the Bishop who did not want to believe Juan Diego’s message that Mary wanted a shrine to be built so people could come to pray. Mary evangelized a tremendous number of people. Juan Diego’s uncle was very sick so he tried not to pass by the same route where Mary had appeared so that he could get a priest to go to anoint his uncle. Ah, ah, Mary appeared to Juan Diego and asked, “where are you going”? When he explained his predicament, Mary uttered the above words, and the uncle was immediately cured. See below some of our runners!

The weekend of December 13th and 14th we had Brother Robert here from Catholic Medical Mission Bread for Life. Below you see a few from our Confirmation classes and our Youth Group helping to package the Portuguese Bread and place the inserts in our bulletin. All proceeds go directly for the needs of children in Africa who have HIV. Unfortunately the weather did not help the cause, but our parishioners were responding very positively well.

PREPARATIVOS DE ADVIENTO/NAVIDAD

En San Nicolás de Tolentino, es costumbre que el sábado anterior al Segundo Domingo de Adviento se celebre uno de los aspectos de la tradición filipina llamada “Simbang Gabi” como preparación para la Navidad. Consiste en la representación de partes de nuestra historia de salvación con narración, canto y dramatización, con la participación de diferentes miembros de nuestra comunidad parroquial de diversas culturas. Agradecemos a Bing Custodio, quien coordina este evento desde hace años con mucho entusiasmo y fervor. La foto a continuación nos muestra un vistazo de la celebración.

El viernes 12 de diciembre, nuestra comunidad parroquial celebró la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. Un aspecto de esta fiesta es diocesano. Las parroquias que desean participar en una larga procesión a pie desde la Co-Catedral de San José en Pacific Street en Brooklyn de regreso a su propia parroquia, se registran formalmente para participar, y este año todos llevaban sudaderas azules. ¡Cuando lo vi en NET, era un mar de azul! Este año, las parroquias de Brooklyn se reunieron en la Misa de las 9:00 a. m. con el Obispo Brennan como celebrante principal; las parroquias de Queens se reunieron en la Misa de la 1:00 p. m. en la Co-Catedral, también con el Obispo Brennan como celebrante principal. Aquí había 40 corredores de nuestra parroquia.

Cuando terminó la Misa de la 1:00 p. m. (casi a las 3:00 p. m.), el Obispo Brennan encendió una antorcha muy alta para cada parroquia. Esta antorcha encendida, que fue llevada durante toda la carrera, simboliza a Jesús como nuestra Luz. Las respectivas parroquias comenzaron a correr, caminar, trotar, etc., cantando y orando durante todo el camino hasta la Iglesia de San Nicolás de Tolentino. ¡Les tomó casi 4 horas llegar aquí, muy cansados y hambrientos! Llegaron justo a tiempo para la Misa de las 7:00 p. m. celebrada aquí con el Obispo Cabezas como celebrante principal. Por cierto, ¡nuestro Padre Noel fue uno de los corredores!

Después de la Misa, hubo comida típica y entretenimiento con piñatas para los niños. Fue una celebración llena de alegría. Muchas personas trabajaron arduamente de diversas maneras para que esta fuera una fiesta memorable. Estamos muy agradecidos con todos los que contribuyeron de alguna manera a esta fiesta.

Las palabras de María a Juan Diego fueron: "¿Acaso no sabes que estoy aquí, que soy tu Madre?". María le había pedido a Juan Diego que fuera a verla para obtener una prueba para el obispo, quien no creía en el mensaje de Juan Diego de que María deseaba que se construyera un santuario para que la gente pudiera ir a orar. María evangelizó a muchísimas personas. El tío de Juan Diego estaba muy enfermo, así que él intentó no pasar por el mismo camino donde se le había aparecido María para poder ir a buscar un sacerdote que ungiera a su tío. De repente, María se le apareció a Juan Diego y le preguntó: "¿Adónde vas?". Cuando él le explicó su situación, María pronunció las palabras mencionadas, y el tío sanó inmediatamente. ¡Vean a algunos de nuestros corredores a continuación!

El fin de semana del 13 y 14 de diciembre tuvimos con nosotros al Hermano Robert de Catholic Medical Mission Bread for Life. A continuación, pueden ver a algunos de nuestros jóvenes de las clases de Confirmación y de nuestro Grupo Juvenil ayudando a empaquetar el pan portugués y a colocar los folletos en nuestro boletín. Todas las ganancias se destinan directamente a las necesidades de los niños con VIH en África. Desafortunadamente, el clima no ayudó, pero nuestros feligreses respondieron de manera muy positiva.

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 21, 2025 GOSPEL MATTHEW 1:18-24**READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW**

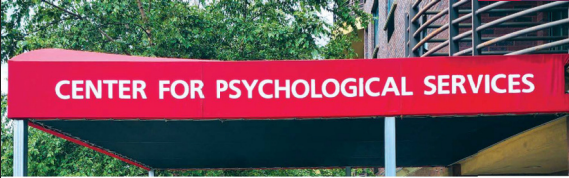
