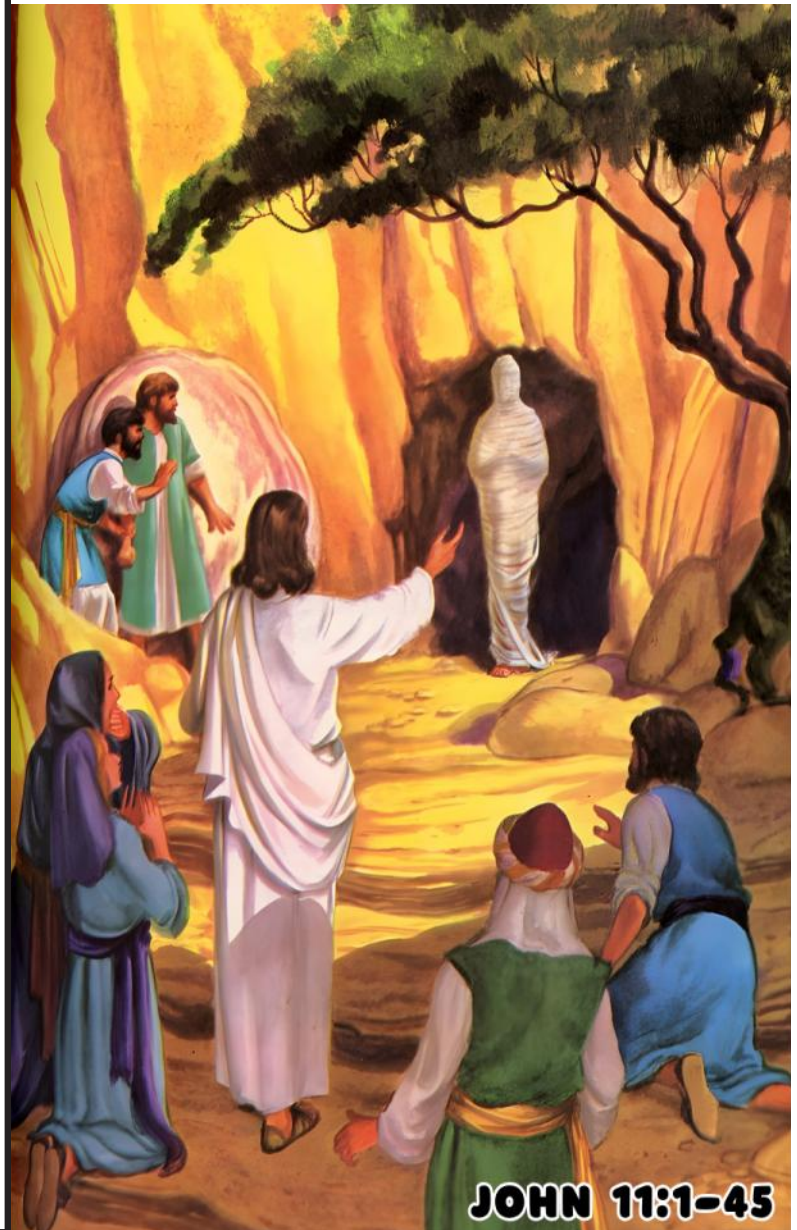

## LENTEN REGULATIONS 2026

**ABSTINENCE** – All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain totally from meat on **Ash Wednesday** (February 18) and **all the Fridays** of Lent.

**FASTING** – All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on **Ash Wednesday** (February 18) and on **Good Friday** (April 3). Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day. Coffee, tea and juice are permitted at any time.

**EASTER DUTY** – After they have been fully initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled in the Easter Season unless, for a good reason, it is fulfilled at another time. By special permission, in the United States of America, the time period for fulfilling this precept is extended to include the period beginning the **First Sunday of Lent** (February 22) to **Pentecost Sunday** (May 24).

**LENTEN RETREAT**

As we know, last Saturday our Deanery Lenten Retreat was held at Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Queens Village. At least 30 of our parishioners were present.

Our Diocese is divided into Deaneries. Briefly I would say that the goal of each Deanery is to share with one another different experiences, support one another whenever possible, etc. Our Deanery is made up of nine parishes: Immaculate Conception, Incarnation, Our Lady of the Cenacle, Our Lady of Lourdes, Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Queen of Peace, St. Gerard Majella, St. Nicholas of Tolentine, and Saints Joachim and Anne.

It was a beautiful experience of prayer. It began with an excellent presentation on the love of the Sacred Heart given by Father Price from Immaculate Conception Church. The love of the Sacred Heart was the main theme chosen for this Lenten Retreat. A very talented song leader and guitarist accompanied us in the Holy Hour led by Father Patrick Longalong. Confession was available throughout the Holy Hour.

I am sure that the Church of the United States will be providing a variety of experiences centered on the Sacred Heart. Why? Every year the bishops of the United States gather twice a year: in Washington DC in November and in one of the states of the United States in June. It is an opportunity for them to discuss, share, and make decisions, etc. Because this year the United States is celebrating its 250th anniversary of Independence, at their meeting in November the bishops decided that on the Feast of the Sacred Heart on June 12, 2026, the whole of the United States will be consecrated to the Sacred Heart.

**FEAST OF THE ANNUNCIATION**

On Wednesday, March 25th, the Church will be celebrating the great Feast of the Annunciation. Throughout the Old Testament the promise of the Messiah was like a golden thread weaved in and out. Finally, the time had come for its fulfillment. An angel came to Mary who was about 15 years old with the message from God that she had been chosen to be the mother of the Promised Messiah. Though she did not understand clearly what or how this was going to be since she was not yet living her marital life with Joseph, she gave her "YES". Thus, for the next nine months she carried Jesus, the Son of God, in her womb. On December 25th we celebrate Jesus' birth in Bethlehem. We are so blessed that while Jesus was dying on the Cross, He entrusted his mother to us.

This feast is very special to my Congregation. We are the Holy Union Sisters of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. When Mary gave her consent to be the Mother of Jesus, her heart and His beat as one, their union. Thus, March 25th is very special to us. Every year we renew our vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience wherever we may be presently missioned. Therefore, for the past nine years that I have been missioned here, I have renewed my vows here at St. Nicholas of Tolentine at the 12:05 Mass. However, this year my Congregation is celebrating the 200th anniversary of its foundation in France. All our Sisters in the United States will be gathering in Massachusetts for this very special celebration this coming Wednesday to together renew our vows and celebrate in a grand way! Please pray for all of us!

Como ya saben, el sábado pasado se celebró nuestro Retiro de Cuaresma del Decanato en la Iglesia de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes, en Queens Village. Al menos 30 de nuestros feligreses estuvieron presentes.

Nuestra Diócesis está dividida en Decanatos. En pocas palabras, diría que el objetivo de cada Decanato es compartir experiencias diversas entre sí, brindarse apoyo mutuo siempre que sea posible, etc. Nuestro Decanato está compuesto por nueve parroquias: Inmaculada Concepción, Encarnación, Nuestra Señora del Cenáculo, Nuestra Señora de Lourdes, Presentación de la Santísima Virgen María, Reina de la Paz, San Gerardo Mayela, San Nicolás de Tolentino y los Santos Joaquín y Ana.

Un ángel se apareció a María quien tenía unos 15 años con el mensaje de Dios de que ella había sido elegida para ser la madre del Mesías Prometido. Aunque no comprendía con claridad qué o cómo sucedería esto, dado que aún no había iniciado su vida conyugal con José, ella dio su "SÍ". Así, durante los nueve meses siguientes, llevó a Jesús el Hijo de Dios en su seno. El 25 de diciembre celebramos el nacimiento de Jesús en Belén. Somos inmensamente bendecidas, pues, mientras Jesús moría en la Cruz, nos confió a su Madre.

**SUNDAY, MARCH 22, 2026 GOSPEL JOHN 11:1-45****READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN**

Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was ill. So the sisters sent word to him saying, "Master, the one you love is ill."

When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you, and you want to go back there?" Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in a day? If one walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. But if one walks at night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him."

He said this, and then told them, "Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken him." So the disciples said to him, "Master, if he is asleep, he will be saved." But Jesus was talking about his death, while they thought that he meant ordinary sleep. So then Jesus said to them clearly, "Lazarus has died. And I am glad for you that I was not there, that you may believe. Let us go to him." So Thomas, called Didymus, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go to die with him."

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles away. And many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."

When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary secretly, saying, "The teacher is here and is asking for you." As soon as she heard this, she rose quickly and went to him. For Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still where Martha had met him. So when the Jews who were with her in the house comforting her saw Mary get up quickly and go out, they followed her, presuming that she was going to the tomb to weep there.

When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come with her weeping, he became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"

So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone.

And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go."

Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.

**DOMINGO 22 DE MARZO DE 2026 JUAN 11,1-45****LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN**

En aquel tiempo, se encontraba enfermo Lázaro, en Betania, el pueblo de María y de su hermana Marta. María era la que una vez ungió al Señor con perfume y le enjugó los pies con su cabellera. El enfermo era su hermano Lázaro. Por eso las dos hermanas le mandaron decir a Jesús: "Señor, el amigo a quien tanto quieres está enfermo".

Al oír esto, Jesús dijo: "Esta enfermedad no acabará en la muerte, sino que servirá para la gloria de Dios, para que el Hijo de Dios sea glorificado por ella".

Jesús amaba a Marta, a su hermana y a Lázaro. Sin embargo, cuando se enteró de que Lázaro estaba enfermo, se detuvo dos días más en el lugar en que se hallaba. Después dijo a sus discípulos: "Vayamos otra vez a Judea". Los discípulos le dijeron: "Maestro, hace poco que los judíos querían apedrearte, ¿y tú vas a volver allá?" Jesús les contestó: "¿Acaso no tiene doce horas el día? El que camina de día no tropieza, porque ve la luz de este mundo; en cambio, el que camina de noche tropieza, porque le falta la luz".

Dijo esto y luego añadió: "Lázaro, nuestro amigo, se ha dormido; pero yo voy ahora a despertarlo". Entonces le dijeron sus discípulos: "Señor, si duerme, es que va a sanar". Jesús hablaba de la muerte, pero ellos creyeron que hablaba del sueño natural. Entonces Jesús les dijo abiertamente: "Lázaro ha muerto, y me alegro por ustedes de no haber estado allí, para que crean. Ahora, vamos allá". Entonces Tomás, por sobrenombre el Gemelo, dijo a los demás discípulos: "Vayamos también nosotros, para morir con él".

Cuando llegó Jesús, Lázaro llevaba ya cuatro días en el sepulcro. Betania quedaba cerca de Jerusalén, como a unos dos kilómetros y medio, y muchos judíos habían ido a ver a Marta y a María para consolarlas por la muerte de su hermano. Apenas oyó Marta que Jesús llegaba, salió a su encuentro; pero María se quedó en casa. Le dijo Marta a Jesús: "Señor, si hubieras estado aquí, no habría muerto mi hermano. Pero aun ahora estoy segura de que Dios te concederá cuanto le pidas". Jesús le dijo: "Tu hermano resucitará". Marta respondió: "Ya sé que resucitará en la resurrección del último día". Jesús le dijo: "Yo soy la resurrección y la vida. El que cree en mí, aunque haya muerto, vivirá; y todo aquel que está vivo y cree en mí, no morirá para siempre. ¿Crees tú esto?" Ella le contestó: "Sí, Señor. Creo firmemente que tú eres el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios, el que tenía que venir al mundo".

Después de decir estas palabras, fue a buscar a su hermana María y le dijo en voz baja: "Ya vino el Maestro y te llama". Al oír esto, María se levantó en el acto y salió hacia donde estaba Jesús, porque él no había llegado aún al pueblo, sino que estaba en el lugar donde Marta lo había encontrado. Los judíos que estaban con María en la casa, consolándola, viendo que ella se levantaba y salía de prisa, pensaron que iba al sepulcro para llorar allí y la siguieron.


