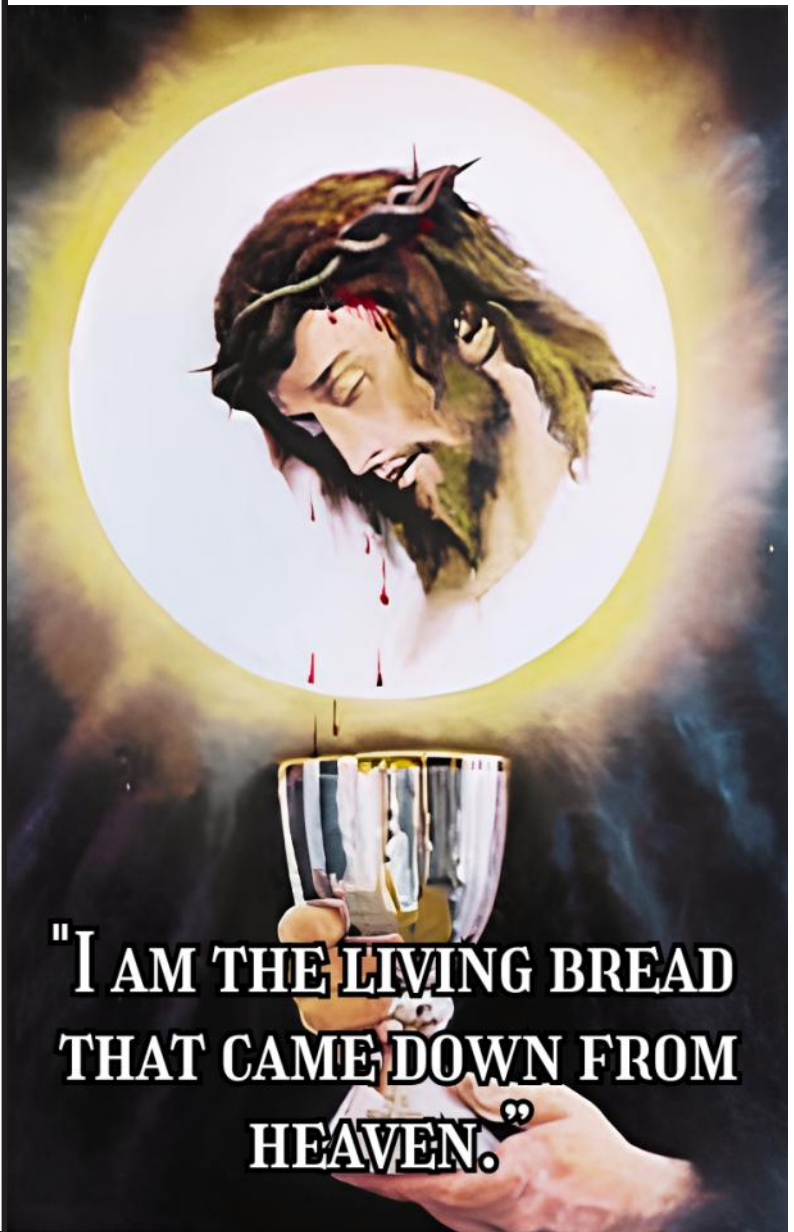

CLOSING CELEBRATION OF MARY'S MONTH

Last Sunday marked the last day of the month of May which is traditionally dedicated to Mary our Mother. Before the 9:30 am Mass, we prayed the rosary. Prior to the final blessing of the Mass, Sister Alice gave a brief reflection on the message of Our Lady of Fatima. Mary repeatedly asked that we pray the rosary for peace, called us to conversion; to change the way we live our everyday lives, and to make reparation for so much sin in the world. If praying the 5 decades of the rosary is not possible for a variety of reasons, perhaps the family could begin by praying 1 decade each day: Our Father, 10 Hail Marys, and Glory be to the Father.

Immediately following this, Mary was crowned. At the end of Mass, we processed with the statue of Our Lady of Fatima to the Grotto where we prayed and then continued the short procession to the image of St. Rita where we prayed and received a blessing. All were invited then to proceed to Tolentine Hall for brunch. The photo below attempts to demonstrate the joyful spirit that all shared.

FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

This past Sunday was the great Feast of the Most Holy Trinity: three Divine Persons in One God. This is a great mystery of our Catholic Faith. Not in the sense that ordinary mystery stories very often can be figured out by the end. It is a great mystery that catechists grapple with teaching our children this doctrine. We can understand it to a certain degree and then our faith and Sacred Scripture help us to believe in this great mystery.

As is so customary in our parish, our liturgical environment helps us focus on the particular mystery or liturgical season that we are living in. As we entered the Church on Saturday/Sunday we saw the large image of the Holy Trinity. Depicting this mystery is a great challenge because only Jesus was Divine and Human; therefore, He had a body. God the Father and God the Holy Spirit are Divine with no human body. However, to help us many times the Father is depicted as an old man with a beard and the Holy Spirit as a dove. But we know that these are not EXACT SYMBOLS! Only Jesus took on a human body.

The Divino Niño Novena for the month of June will be this Tuesday, June 9th, in Our Lady's Chapel. The novena takes place within the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. All are invited to the Faith Formation Center for refreshments following the novena.

CELEBRACIÓN DE CLAUSURA DEL MES DE MARÍA

El domingo pasado marcó el último día del mes de mayo, el cual está tradicionalmente dedicado a María, nuestra Madre. Antes de la Misa de las 9:30 a. m., rezamos el rosario. Previo a la bendición final de la Misa, la Hermana Alice ofreció una breve reflexión sobre el mensaje de Nuestra Señora de Fátima. María pidió reiteradamente que rezáramos el rosario por la paz, nos llamó a la conversión a cambiar la forma en que vivimos nuestra vida cotidiana y a hacer reparación por tanto pecado en el mundo. Si rezar los cinco misterios del rosario no resulta posible por diversas razones, tal vez la familia podría comenzar rezando un misterio cada día: un Padre Nuestro, diez Avemarias y un Gloria al Padre.

Inmediatamente después, se procedió a coronar a María. Al finalizar la Misa, salimos en procesión con la imagen de Nuestra Señora de Fátima hacia la Gruta, donde rezamos; luego continuamos la breve procesión hasta la imagen de Santa Rita, ante la cual rezamos y recibimos una bendición. Posteriormente, se invitó a todos a dirigirse al Salón Tolentine para disfrutar de un *brunch*. La fotografía que aparece a continuación busca reflejar el espíritu de alegría que todos compartieron.

FIESTA DE LA SANTÍSIMA TRINIDAD

El domingo pasado celebramos la gran Fiesta de la Santísima Trinidad: tres Personas Divinas en un solo Dios. Este constituye un gran misterio de nuestra fe católica; no en el sentido de que los misterios de las historias comunes esas que a menudo logramos desentrañar hacia el final del relato puedan ser resueltos por la razón humana. Es un gran misterio con el que los catequistas se enfrentan al intentar enseñar esta doctrina a nuestros niños. Podemos comprenderlo hasta cierto punto; a partir de ahí, nuestra fe y la Sagrada Escritura nos ayudan a creer en este gran misterio.

Como ya es costumbre en nuestra parroquia, nuestro entorno litúrgico nos ayuda a centrarnos en el misterio particular o en el tiempo litúrgico que estamos viviendo. Al entrar en la iglesia el sábado o el domingo, pudimos contemplar la gran imagen de la Santísima Trinidad. Representar este misterio supone un gran desafío, ya que solo Jesús fue a la vez Divino y Humano; por consiguiente, solo Él poseyó un cuerpo físico. Dios Padre y Dios Espíritu Santo son seres divinos que carecen de cuerpo humano. No obstante, para ayudarnos en nuestra comprensión, en muchas ocasiones se representa al Padre como un anciano barbado y al Espíritu Santo como una paloma. ¡Pero sabemos que estos no son símbolos exactos! Solo Jesús asumió un cuerpo humano.

La Novena del Divino Niño correspondiente al mes de junio se celebrará este martes, 9 de junio, en la Capilla de Nuestra Señora. La novena tiene lugar durante la exposición del Santísimo Sacramento. Todos están invitados al Centro de Formación en la Fe para compartir un refrigerio al finalizar la novena.

SUNDAY, JUNE 7, 2026 GOSPEL JOHN 6:51-58

READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you.

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me.

This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

DOMINGO 7 DE JUNIO DE 2026 JUAN 6,51-58**LECTURA DEL SANTO EVANGELIO SEGÚN SAN JUAN**

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a los judíos: "Yo soy el pan vivo que ha bajado del cielo; el que coma de este pan vivirá para siempre. Y el pan que yo les voy a dar es mi carne para que el mundo tenga vida".

Entonces los judíos se pusieron a discutir entre sí: "¿Cómo puede éste darnos a comer su carne?"

Jesús les dijo: "Yo les aseguro: Si no comen la carne del Hijo del hombre y no beben su sangre, no podrán tener vida en ustedes. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre, tiene vida eterna y yo lo resucitaré el último día.

Mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre, permanece en mí y yo en él. Como el Padre, que me ha enviado, posee la vida y yo vivo por él, así también el que me come vivirá por mí.

Éste es el pan que ha bajado del cielo; no es como el maná que comieron sus padres, pues murieron. El que come de este pan vivirá para siempre".

REFLECTION

- I am the living bread. Not cake, Lord. Not nourishment just for feast days; but our daily staple diet. Through this extraordinary dispensation of the Eucharist, God identifies himself not just with humanity, but with the material world. Through this food, we become part of God as he becomes part of us.
- What we receive in the small piece of bread or the sip of wine at the Eucharist is the gift of life from Jesus. This is a sharing in the life of God; in the fragility of the bread and wine is strong food, and joyful drink - fruit of God's creation and work of human hands. It is the gift of God who has become one of us. It is the gift of love with sacrifice. If we have put self out for others in big or small ways, or have cried for another's woes or laughed for another's joy, or held a hand in sympathy or just listened when there were no answers, we know the quality of this gift. In the Eucharist God is close in his creation, In Jesus we can recognize God near at hand. Pope Benedict writes - 'we have to rediscover God, not just any God, but the God that has a human face, because when we see Jesus Christ, we see God'.
- The mind may have questions about what Jesus says but my prayer draws me to listen to him, heart to heart. He leads me to appreciate the closeness to which he calls me.
- 'Eat', 'live' and 'abide' are all words that belong to the home. Jesus invites me to bring anything in my life that is unsettled or out of place, that it may find its home in him.
- There was once a king who engaged a street artist to make a painting of the Last Supper. He wanted a picture of Jesus and his friends at their farewell meal for his banquet room. The artist had Jesus and his friends around the supper table ,but he also included all kinds of people around the table, showing people from many races. There were people who were sick, lame and crippled; men and women; young and old; beggars and misfits and some not very nice people . When the King saw the painting he went into a rage ,and shouted at the artist, 'Of what is this a painting?' The artist said 'Your Highness, this is a painting of God who delights in all people ; all saints and all sorts are welcomed to the Kingdom and the earthly banquet...and that is my understanding of the Last Supper, Holy Communion and Eucharist.'

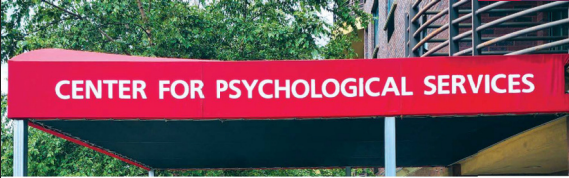
