From the Pastor's Desk...

There is something hopeful about the image Jesus gives us in this Sunday's Gospel. A farmer goes out to sow seed, scattering it generously across the field. Some falls on the path, some on rocky ground, some among thorns, and some on rich soil. At first glance, it may seem like a story about different kinds of soil, but it is really a story about the generosity of God. He never stops sowing His Word into our lives. Through the Scriptures, the Eucharist, the people He places in our lives, and even through life's joys and struggles, God is constantly inviting us to grow closer to Him. As Isaiah reminds us in the first reading, God's Word never returns empty; it always accomplishes His purpose, often in ways we do not immediately see. The question, then, is not whether God is speaking, but whether we are listening. At times our hearts become like the hardened path, distracted by life's many demands. At other times we are like rocky ground, enthusiastic until difficulties arise, or like the thorny soil where worries and distractions leave little room for God's grace to grow. The Lord continually invites us to cultivate hearts that are open, receptive, and willing to bear fruit.

As I begin my ministry here at St. Nicholas of Tolentine, I would like to express my heartfelt thanks to everyone who has welcomed me so warmly. Your kind greetings, prayers, words of encouragement, and patience have been a tremendous blessing during these first days. As many of you can probably imagine, I have hit the ground running. Parish life does not pause while a new pastor unpacks his boxes. The schedule moves forward, responsibilities continue, and there is much to learn. I have already begun assessing the needs of our parish and have found several maintenance issues in our facilities that require attention. We are also reviewing and reorganizing some of our administrative processes so that we can serve our parish family more efficiently. At the same time, we are looking ahead to our new pastoral year beginning this fall to ensure that our calendar of programs, ministries, and parish activities is well organized and prepared.



All of this reminds me of today's Gospel. Before a harvest can be expected, the soil must first be cultivated. A farmer patiently removes rocks, clears away weeds, and prepares the ground so that the seed can flourish. In much the same way, a parish is always being cultivated. We are blessed with a rich history and many faithful parishioners who have generously given their time and talents over the years. Now we have an opportunity to continue building upon that foundation together. My hope is not simply that we maintain what we have inherited, but that together we continue growing into a vibrant parish where every person can encounter Christ, deepen their faith, and discover their place in our parish family.

As we move forward together, I ask for your continued prayers, your patience, and your collaboration. The work of building a strong parish belongs to all of us. Every act of kindness, every volunteer, every ministry, every prayer, and every person who says "yes" to serving helps prepare the soil for God to accomplish great things. This week, let us each reflect on the question Jesus places before us: *What kind of soil is my heart today?* May we allow the Lord to remove whatever keeps us from receiving His Word so that, together as the family of St. Nicholas of Tolentine, we may bear abundant fruit for His Kingdom.

Desde el escritorio del pastor...

Hay algo esperanzador en la imagen que Jesús nos presenta en el Evangelio de este domingo. Un sembrador sale a sembrar, esparciendo la semilla con generosidad sobre el campo. Una parte cae junto al camino, otra entre piedras, otra entre espinos y otra en tierra buena. A primera vista, parece una parábola sobre diferentes tipos de terreno, pero en realidad es una historia sobre la generosidad de Dios. Él nunca deja de sembrar su Palabra en nuestra vida. A través de las Sagradas Escrituras, de la Eucaristía, de las personas que pone en nuestro camino e incluso de las alegrías y dificultades de la vida, Dios nos invita constantemente a acercarnos más a Él. Como nos recuerda el profeta Isaías en la primera lectura, la Palabra de Dios nunca vuelve vacía; siempre cumple el propósito para el cual fue enviada, muchas veces de maneras que no podemos ver de inmediato. La pregunta, entonces, no es si Dios nos está hablando, sino si nosotros estamos escuchando. A veces nuestro corazón se parece al camino endurecido, distraído por las múltiples preocupaciones de la vida diaria. Otras veces somos como el terreno pedregoso, llenos de entusiasmo hasta que llegan las dificultades; o como el terreno lleno de espinos, donde las preocupaciones y distracciones dejan poco espacio para que la gracia de Dios crezca. El Señor nos invita continuamente a cultivar un corazón abierto, dispuesto a recibir su Palabra y dar fruto.

Al comenzar mi ministerio aquí en San Nicolás de Tolentino, deseo expresar mi más sincero agradecimiento a todos los que me han recibido con tanta calidez. Sus saludos, sus oraciones, sus palabras de aliento y su paciencia han sido una gran bendición durante estos primeros días. Como muchos podrán imaginar, he comenzado este ministerio con un ritmo muy intenso. La vida parroquial no se detiene mientras un nuevo párroco termina de desempacar sus cajas. El calendario sigue avanzando, las responsabilidades continúan y hay mucho por aprender. Ya he comenzado a evaluar las necesidades de nuestra parroquia y he encontrado varios asuntos de mantenimiento en nuestras instalaciones que requieren atención. También estamos revisando y reorganizando algunos de nuestros procesos administrativos para servir mejor y con mayor eficiencia a nuestra familia parroquial. Al mismo tiempo, ya estamos mirando hacia el nuevo año pastoral que comenzará este otoño para asegurarnos de que nuestro calendario de programas, ministerios y actividades parroquiales esté bien organizado y preparado.



Todo esto me hace pensar en el Evangelio de hoy. Antes de esperar una buena cosecha, la tierra debe ser preparada. El agricultor retira las piedras, limpia los espinos y trabaja pacientemente el terreno para que la semilla pueda dar fruto. De la misma manera, una parroquia siempre está en proceso de cultivarse. Hemos recibido una hermosa herencia de fe gracias a tantos feligreses que, con generosidad, han entregado su tiempo y sus talentos durante muchos años. Ahora tenemos la oportunidad de seguir construyendo sobre ese sólido fundamento. Mi esperanza no es simplemente mantener lo que hemos heredado, sino continuar creciendo juntos como una parroquia viva, donde cada persona pueda encontrarse con Cristo, profundizar su fe y descubrir el lugar que Dios le ha preparado dentro de nuestra familia parroquial.

Mientras avanzamos juntos, les pido que continúen acompañándome con sus oraciones, su paciencia y su colaboración. La tarea de construir una parroquia fuerte nos pertenece a todos. Cada acto de bondad, cada voluntario, cada ministerio, cada oración y cada persona que responde generosamente al llamado de servir ayuda a preparar la tierra para que Dios haga grandes cosas entre nosotros. Esta semana, los invito a hacernos una sencilla pregunta: ¿Qué clase de tierra es hoy mi corazón? Caring for Our Parish Home

We extend our heartfelt thanks to everyone who has faithfully supported our Parish Maintenance Collection. Your generosity is an act of stewardship that helps us care for the church and parish buildings that have served generations of faithful Catholics. Every contribution, no matter the size, assists us in preserving these facilities so they can continue to be places of worship, prayer, ministry, and community for years to come.



The darker area on this rectory roof shows where the water is pooling and seeping down through the ceiling of the rectory. We are currently addressing this issue before addressing the water damage inside the building.



Along the second floor hallway, you will find many areas where water has come through from the roof just like this. It is even worse inside Fr. Abraham's rooms.

Like many churches and parish buildings throughout New York City, our parish campus has naturally experienced the effects of age and daily use over the years. While we are blessed with facilities that have faithfully served our parish family for many decades, they require ongoing maintenance, repairs, and occasional renovations to remain safe, functional, and welcoming. Some needs are immediately visible, while others remain hidden until they become more serious. Rather than simply telling you that repairs are needed, we believe it is important to show you the areas that require attention so that you can

better understand the work that lies ahead.

The photos included this week show some of the water damage in the rectory caused by roof leaks that have gone unaddressed for some time. One of the areas affected is Fr. Abraham's room, where the damage has become significant enough that he will need to temporarily move to another room until the roof can be repaired and the affected areas restored. Addressing problems like these promptly helps prevent more extensive damage and reduces the cost of future repairs.

Thank you once again for your generosity, your prayers, and your continued commitment to our parish. Together, we are not simply maintaining buildings—we are caring for the home of our parish family. Your support helps ensure that our church, rectory, and parish facilities remain safe, welcoming, and ready to serve the people of God for generations to come.

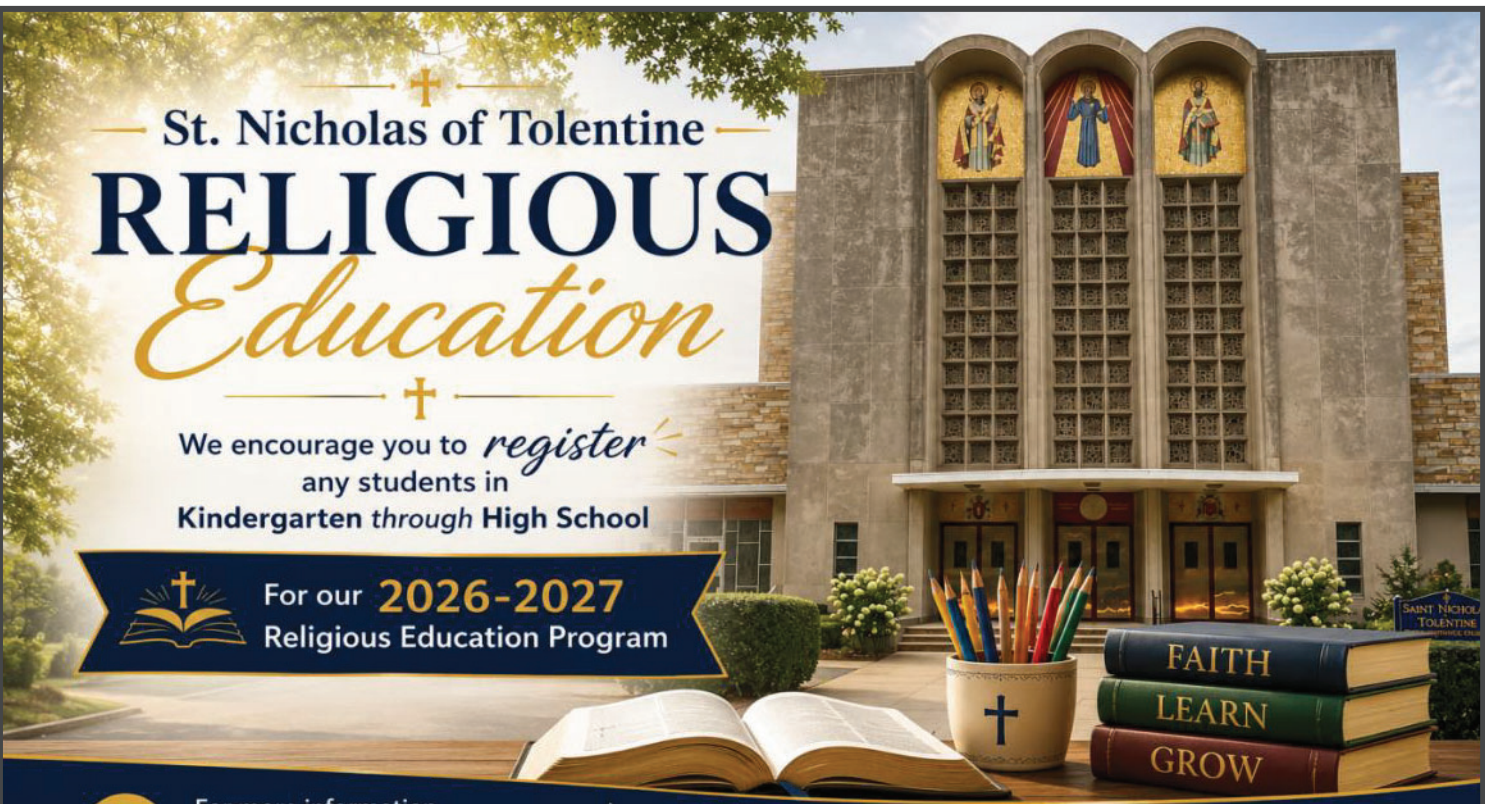

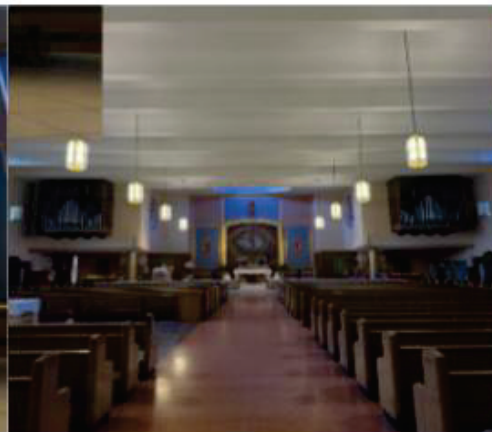
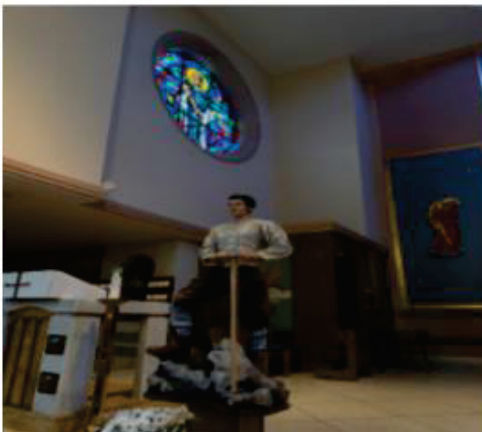
