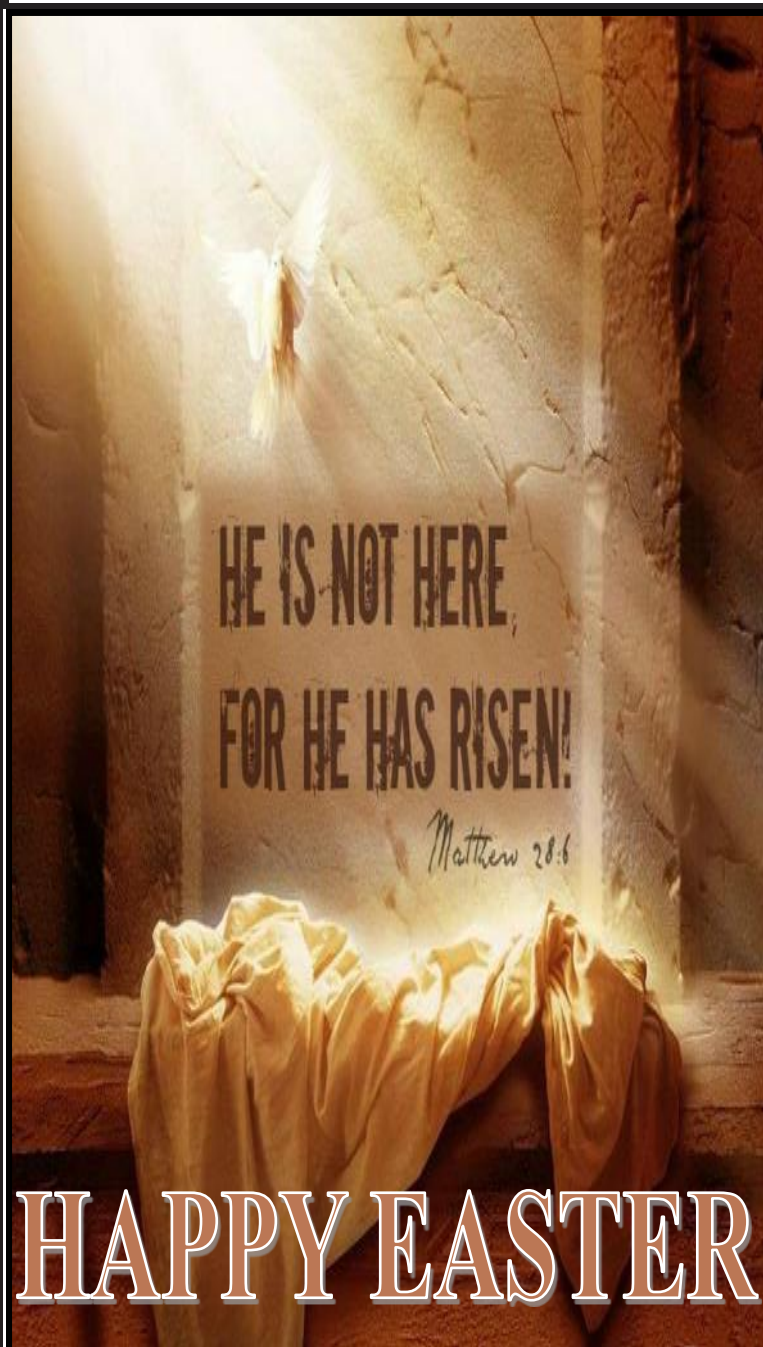

Our Lenten season and Triduum have come to a close with the great jubilant celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. Little holy water bottles are being given out after the Masses as you leave the church, not within the church. This is just another protocol that Bishop DiMarzio has asked us to implement. All with the focus on keeping everyone as safe as possible. With this same concern in mind, during the Easter Vigil celebration, we were not able to hold our individual candle as the Easter Candle is processed down the aisle and as we renew our baptismal promises. However, we must be grateful that at least this year we have been able to celebrate Holy Week, the Triduum, and Easter though in a limited way. There is no doubt that we all recall with heavy hearts how last year there was NO celebration during the coronavirus.

Next Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday. Again due to covid the celebration of DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY in Stockbridge, Massachusetts cannot be as in past years with the exception of last year. Next weekend we will be selling outside the Church some framed images of the Divine Mercy and some Divine Mercy pamphlets. In 1931, Our Lord appeared to St. Faustina in a vision. She saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching his garment in the area of His heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. She gazed intently at the Lord in silence, her soul filled with awe, but also with great joy. Jesus said to her: "Paint an image according to the pattern you see with the signature; Jesus, I trust in You. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory. I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature; "Jesus, I trust in You". I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and then throughout the world."

Nuestro tiempo de Cuaresma y Triduo han llegado a su fin con la gran celebración jubilosa de la Resurrección de Jesús. Se reparten pequeñas botellas de agua bendita después de las misas al salir de la iglesia, no dentro de la iglesia. Este es solo otro protocolo que el obispo DiMarzio nos ha pedido que implementemos. Todo con el objetivo de mantener a todos lo más seguros posible. Con esta misma preocupación en mente, durante la celebración de la Vigilia Pascual, no pudimos sostener nuestra vela individual mientras el Cirio Pascual se procesa por el pasillo y renovamos nuestras promesas bautismales. Sin embargo, debemos estar agradecidos de que al menos este año hemos podido celebrar la Semana Santa, el Triduo y la Pascua aunque de forma limitada. No hay duda de que todos recordamos con gran pesar cómo el año pasado NO hubo celebración durante el coronavirus.

El próximo domingo es el domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Nuevamente debido a covid la celebración del DOMINGO DE LA MISERICORDIA DIVINA en Stockbridge, Massachusetts no puede ser como en años pasados con la excepción del año pasado. El próximo fin de semana estaremos vendiendo fuera de la Iglesia algunas imágenes enmarcadas de la Divina Misericordia y algunos folletos de la Divina Misericordia. En 1931, Nuestro Señor se apareció a Santa Faustina en una visión. Vio a Jesús vestido con una túnica blanca con la mano derecha levantada en señal de bendición. Su mano izquierda tocaba su manto en el área de Su corazón, de donde salían dos grandes rayos, uno rojo y el otro pálido. Ella miró fijamente al Señor en silencio, su alma llena de asombro, pero también de gran gozo. Jesús le dijo: "Pinta una imagen según el patrón que ves con la firma; Jesús, en Ti confío. Prometo que el alma que venere esta imagen no perecerá. También prometo la victoria sobre los enemigos que ya están aquí en la tierra, especialmente en la hora de la muerte. Yo mismo la defenderé como Mi propia gloria. Ofrezco a la gente un vaso con el que seguirán viniendo en busca de gracias a la fuente de la misericordia. Ese recipiente es esta imagen con la firma; "Jesús, en Ti confío". Deseo que esta imagen sea venerada, primero en tu capilla, y luego en todo el mundo".

SUNDAY, APRIL 04, 2021 GOSPEL JOHN 20:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, “They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don’t know where they put him.”

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in.

When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

DOMINGO, APRIL 04, 2021 EVANGELIO JUAN 20:1-9

Lectura del santo Evangelio según San Juan

El primer día después del sábado, estando todavía oscuro, fue María Magdalena al sepulcro y vio removida la piedra que lo cerraba. Echó a correr, llegó a la casa donde estaban Simón Pedro y el otro discípulo, a quien Jesús amaba, y les dijo: “Se han llevado del sepulcro al Señor y no sabemos dónde lo habrán puesto”.

Salieron Pedro y el otro discípulo camino del sepulcro. Los dos iban corriendo juntos, pero el otro discípulo corrió más aprisa que Pedro y llegó primero al sepulcro, e inclinándose, miró los lienzos puestos en el suelo, pero no entró.

En eso llegó también Simón Pedro, que lo venía siguiendo, y entró en el sepulcro. Contempló los lienzos puestos en el suelo y el sudario, que había estado sobre la cabeza de Jesús, puesto no con los lienzos en el suelo, sino doblado en sitio aparte. Entonces entró también el otro discípulo, el que había llegado primero al sepulcro, y vio y creyó, porque hasta entonces no habían entendido las Escrituras, según las cuales Jesús debía resucitar de entre los muertos.

Gospel Reflection...

Today's reading says of the two apostles that 'as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead.' I too ask for the grace to grow in my understanding of this great reality: St Paul calls the Resurrection the foundation of our faith, but I have no direct experience of it except for the Risen Jesus.

The great gifts of Easter are hope and faith. Hope: which makes us have that confidence in God, in his ultimate triumph, and in his goodness and love, which nothing can shake. Faith: the belief that Christ has triumphed over evil despite appearances and that the Resurrection is the definitive act in human history.

"We proclaim the resurrection of Christ", says Pope Francis, "when his light illuminates the dark moments of our existence, and we are able share it with others; when we know when to smile with those who smile, and weep with those who weep; when we accompany those who are sad and at risk of losing hope; when we recount our experience of Faith to those who are searching for meaning and happiness...and there - with our attitude, with our witness, with our life - we say 'Jesus is Risen,' with our soul."
